THE PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY

4.1.	
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The Pacific Coast Highway is one of the most beautiful roads in the world. If you want to get the most out of travelling along it, don't rush. On your journey you'll have the chance to admire spectacular mountains, towering trees, perfect beaches and endless sky. There are also many interesting places where you can stop during the trip to go surfing, hiking and even whale watching. Even a week is not enough to see everything that the Pacific Coast Highway has to offer.

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From end-to-end, the highway is 1,675 miles long. It runs along the western coast of the USA. Drivers heading north eventually reach Olympia in Washington State, and for those going south the final destination is San Diego in California. The most heavily used part of the highway is a distance of 560 miles between San Francisco and San Diego.

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There is some obvious risk created by heavy traffic near cities. Another thing to be aware of is that outside of built-up areas the Pacific Coast Highway does not have barriers in many places where the road runs along the ocean coast and through mountain regions. Many accidents happen on these sections of the highway because of careless driving as well as heavy rain, falling rocks and mudslides.

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If you're driving from south to north, do the trip in the spring so that when you reach the north, the weather is already warm there. And if you're driving north to south, the opposite applies and you should do the trip in the autumn. In July and August, you have the best chance of almost perfect weather, but you also have the busiest hotels and high-season prices.
