

McDowell, 475th Infantry, Burma; Major E. T. Hancock, 5307th Provisional Unit; Asst. Adjutant Thomas J. Dalton; Willard C. Nelson. 475th Infantry. Need to hear from a Doctor or anyone who remembers me having malaria so many times while in CBI. Many of us have found that our medical records were destroyed and are having a hard time getting a record of our illnesses established. I had malaria 37 times in one year over there, and this wasn't put on my discharge. In order to file a claim, it is important that I get in touch with someone who can help me get this established.
