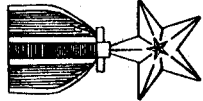

BURMA STAR HONORS MARAUDER'S

The Burma Star dedication of the First American Branch held in Washington, D.C. this weekend was truly a grand occasion with all the style and tradition of the British at their finest. I was honored to be asked by the Chairman, Dr. William Houpt to attend as a representative for MERRILL'S MARAUDERS. Little did I know what this was to mean.

Before he died, Lord Mountbatten signed the charter to form the First American Branch of the Burma Star Association. Had he lived, he would have been here to do the dedication. When Mountbatten was asked what American groups he would like to be represented at the dedication, he asked that MERRILL'S MARAUDERS be included. The Viscount Slim, son of General Slim came in Mountbatten's place to make the dedication and lay the wreaths at Arlington Cemetery. General Wedemeyer is the 1st President of the American Branch. Well over 400 flew over from Great Britain and many came down from Canada. People with Titles and outstanding accomplishments were everywhere — I could not begin to list all of them.

Program. I'm most grateful to all of you who came from all parts of the United States to join your Marauder comrades for this important milestone in Marauder history. United States Capital to the Viscount Slim. He received it very well and said that he would fly it at his home in England when he had American guests.

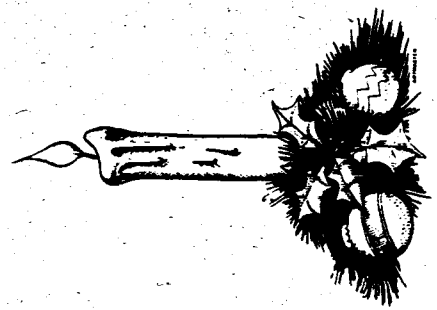
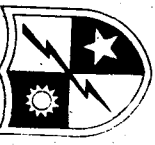

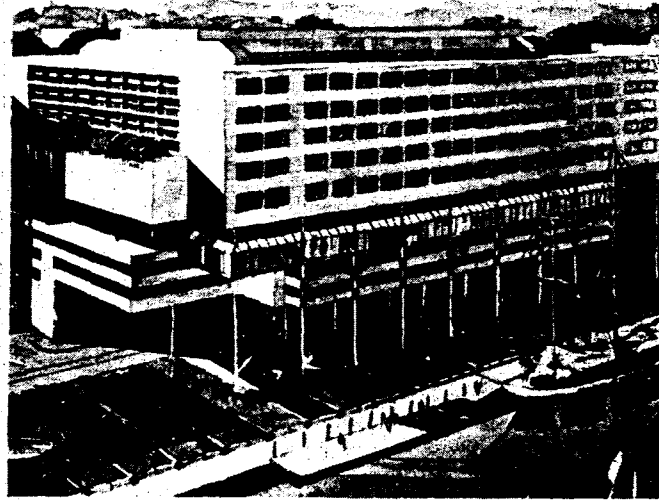

Minutes of 35th Annual Reunion Business Meeting; Henry VIII Inn, St. Louis; MO Sunday, September 6, 1981.

Reports: Treasurer-Herb Clofine, General Balance-\$3741, Executive Secretary-\$616.03, Savings Account-\$2,144.10, Total-\$6,501.13, Reunion Chairman: Tom Martini, Total Banquet attendance 357. Unfinished Business: None.

Motions to Amend By-Laws: Favorably recommended by Board of Directors.

To provide for an Annual Audit Committee of three members of the Board of Directors, other than elected officers, to be designated each Reunion by the President. Their responsibilities will be to inspect Books, Records and Expenses of the prior year, not to include Reunion Expenses, and to report their findings to the Annual Directors Meeting held during Reunion. Moved by Joe Magnotta. Seconded by Pat Perrone. No discussion. Unanimously adopted.

A motion to provide that any motion to expend funds, made from the floor of the Regular Business Meeting, must first be presented to the Board of Directors, for an Impact Study, whereupon the Board of Directors will

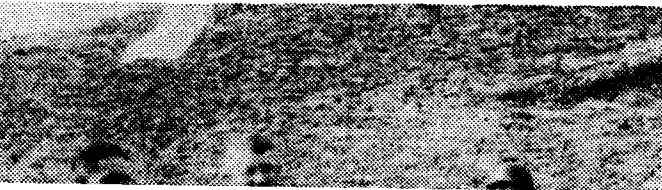
