PHILOSOPHY & HISTORY

The McHari College & University (MCCU) is a unique private learning organisation of higher education for adults with its main base in Nassau, Bahamas, on New Providence Island and other centers in various Family Islands. The philosophy of MCCU is to promote a better world through educational and cultural encounters.

MCCU (formerly ICS Bahamas, a correspondence school) was founded in 1979 by Dr. Kevin J. Turnquest-Alcena, Chancellor of the College; The Honorable Dr. Justice Nicholas Liverpool, former Appeal Court Judge in Belize and now President of Dominica; Ms. Kendolyn Cartwright, Attorney-at-Law and first President of MCCU; Rev. Emmette Weir; Dr. Richard Clarke of Pennsylvania; and the late Sir Leonard Knowles, first Chief Justice of The Bahamas.

MCCU has its license with the Office of the Attorney General as a non-profit organisation and is registered with the Bahamas Ministry of Education.

Since 1979, over 16,800 students have graduated and achieved various diplomas and degrees from MCCU. In addition, MCCU has awarded scholarships to many Bahamians.

In 1990 [until 2001] MCCU launched the Developmental Skills Diploma Programme, headed by the late Mrs. Agatha Collie, Educator; the late Mr. Kenneth Palmer, former CEO of Bahamas Copier; and Mr. Kenneth Francis, C.B.E., Ph.D., former Publisher and General Manager of The Nassau Guardian (1844) Ltd., along with 64 Bahamian teachers. McHari College & University trained over 3,000 individuals, including staff preparing to enter the workforce of Atlantis Resorts. Among these individuals in the Developmental Skills Diploma Programme were 600 young people, many of whom were involved in violent crimes. Dr. Alcena mentored them and provided positive role models and unconditional love for many of whom were former gang members, along with teaching educational skills. Many of the young people who completed the Developmental Skills Diploma Programme have gone on to become productive and successful professionals.

McHari College & University offers courses leading to certificates, diplomas, and vocational studies as well as academic programmes. On June 10, 1999, MCCU was registered with the Bahamas Ministry of Education to offer the Diploma, Associate's and Bachelor's Degree Programmes in International Trust Administration. On August 25, 1999 the Ministry of Education also registered MCCU

to offer the Master's Degree Programmes in International Trust Administration and Investment Management as part of its mission to make education affordable and convenient for all students locally and internationally.

In addition, MCCU offers courses and workshops in adult education and worldwide seminars. In short, our educational efforts are relevant to people of all ages and backgrounds, stressing a multicultural, ethical, and environmental approach. The College is particularly suitable for the 'Global Village'. A central concept in our educational philosophy is that people of the world have the fundamental right to know what is going on. The College is also very concerned with ethics and the environment in all of our endeavors. Therefore, courses in all of these areas are offered to foster a common base of understanding and operation amongst our community.

MCCU has formed an internal Quality Assurance Committee to assist in the provision of outstanding education in certificate, diploma, undergraduate, graduate and professional areas by fostering the improvement of quality in education and all related services provided. This internal Quality Assurance Committee reports to the Board of Governors of the College, who oversees the Committee's operations. This Committee aims to ensure that there are appropriate procedures for the assurance of quality within the College and for the promotion of quality improvement in both teaching and non-teaching areas for the benefit of students, locally and globally.

MCCU is a part of the new global community, and is, as noted, multicultural in outlook. The College sees itself as being part of the frontiers of the new international information age. The selection of texts and other international literature to accompany our curricula, our methods including audio and visual aids, telecourses, on-site seminars, and our immense efforts to bring together students from diverse cultures all over the world are all part of our multicultural philosophy.

Part of our goals is to help develop a world of peaceful existence and environmental sustenance, while calling all cultures to unite.

MCCU entered into Articulation Agreements with the **Ministry of Higher Education** (May 5, 2003), **Havana University** (August 24, 2006) and **The Higher Technical University "Jose Antonio Echeverria" (Cujae)** (August

30, 2006), all in the Republic of Cuba. By virtue of these agreements the students at MCCU have access to all of the universities' libraries, scientific and technical materials. The Ministry of Higher Education, Havana University and The Higher Technical University "Jose Antonio Echeverria will also facilitate its infrastructure for the developing of all the courses, events, conferences, seminars and workshops in the scientific or academic fields agreed by all parties. Note that the universities' libraries are also online and may be accessed by students while in the Republic of Cuba.

In 2006 MCCU established a School of Pharmacy and currently has students registered in the Bachelor of Science Degree Programme in Pharmacy and the Master of Science Degree Programme in Clinical Pharmacy in both, Nassau and Freeport, The Bahamas. The Dean of the School of Pharmacy is Dr. Miriam Cires; the Registrar of the School of Pharmacy is Dr. Maura Wade; and the President of the School of Pharmacy is Dr. Vivienne Lockhart. The lecturers and professors for the Pharmacy Programmes travel from the Republic of Cuba to facilitate these programmes in fulfillment of the Articulation Agreements signed. All of the lecturers and professors for the pharmacy programmes possess medical degrees and specialize in pharmacy, which is historic. Students also travel to the Republic of Cuba for their internship.

In 2007 MCCU established a School of Facility Management and currently has students registered in the Bachelor of Science Degree Programme in Facility Management.

By the year 2012, MCCU's global vision is to have its own campus in New Providence, The Bahamas.

Captain Anthony J. Allens has dedicated most of his entire public career to military service in The Royal Bahamas Defence Force. Joining The Britannia Royal Naval College as subaltern in 1977 and rising up through the ranks from Executive and Operations Officer, to Commanding Officer, Chief Staff Officer, Commander and in 1992, Captain of The Coral Harbour Base.

The Royal Bahamas Defence Force was an excellent training ground for Captain Allens who, during his thirty plus years of military service, gained the solid leadership and strategic skills which have earned him his appointment to the prestigious position of Controller for The Bahamas Port Authority. Captain Allens took an early retirement from the Public Service in order to pursue more challenging ventures. He is President/CEO of his consultancy company Viking Marine Ltd., and has a number of other business interests. Dr Allens is currently the Vice Chancellor of MCCU, having served as Dean of Academic Affairs since retiring from the Government service

Among his colleagues, Captain Allens is described as a fair but firm gentleman who consistently maintains high ethical standards and is famous for creating innovative and progressive solutions to business and military problems. Captain Allens' ability to think analytically is largely attributed to his sound military training at The Royal Naval Staff College in Greenwich, London and his graduate studies in Economics, Political Science and Strategic Planning at The University of Manchester, United Kingdom. In addition, Captain Allens has attended numerous training courses in Security Intelligence, Industrial Relations, Business Administration and Port Management Development in the United Kingdom, Canada and the Caribbean. Captain Allens currently holds a Doctor of Philosophy in Public Administration, and LLB (hon) and LLM (hons).

During his distinguished career in The Defence Force, Captain Allens was awarded on several occasions and received The Defence Force Gallantry Medal, The Defence Force Traumatic Service Medal, The Defence Force Long Service Medal and The Defence Force Inauguration Medal for his excellent service.

In addition to working hard and excelling in his career, Captain Allens still finds time to give back to The Bahamian Community. As a Distinguished Lieutenant Governor (DLG) 2000-2001 for the Kiwanis Sunshine Division 22, DLG Anthony worked throughout the community to upgrade skills and effect positive changes in the lives of Bahamian youth. In his service career life, DLG Anthony has dedicated thousands of hours of volunteer time to community service through his work as member of the Kiwanis Club of Over-the-Hill where he has held various positions including Director, Distinguished Secretary, and President of Merit. He is a two time holder of The Kiwanian of the Year, the Mel Osborne and the George Hixon Awards, for his dedicated service and contributions to Kiwanis.

A past Grand Master of Mecca Grand Lodge, and also served as Commander in Chief Saturn's Consistory, and Chief Rabban Lamours of the Shrine Mystic Temple, High Priest Zerubbabel Holy Royal Arch Chapter, Worshipful Master of Squires of the Square Table Lodge, Grand Patron Heroines of Jordan Grand Chapter, Joshua of Margaret Belcher Heroines of Jericho Grand Chapter, and currently an Active 33° and Last Degree. Most recently Brother Allens was elected as the Grand Senior Warden of Modern Free and Accepted masons of the World, a position he will hold for the next 4 years

A proud member of Matthew's Anglican Churchmen, and apart from everything else, the things which have, and continue to anchor Captain Anthony J. Allens is his strong belief in God, commitment to family and love of community service.

John W. Ashe, who holds a Ph.D in Bioengineering from the University of Pennsylvania, has been a member of the Foreign Service of Antigua and Barbuda since 1989. He has held a variety of diplomatic positions and is currently Antigua and Barbuda's Ambassador/Permanent Representative to the United Nations, Ambassador to the World Trade Organizations and chief negotiator for sustainable development issues; Ambassador Ashe also has ministerial responsibilities for the WTO and sustainable development matters.

During the Johannesburg World Summit on Sustainable Development in 2002 (also known as Rio+10), Ambassador Ashe chaired the negotiations on Chapter X of the Johannesburg Plan on Implementation (JPOI): Means of Implementation, and in this capacity oversaw the work of the Summit aimed at ensuring that global economic and financial rules, systems and markets support sustainable development. In 2010, Ambassador Ashe was elected Co-Chairman of the Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development (also known as Rio+20), to be held in Rio de Janeiro in June 2012, and will co-lead negotiations aimed at securing renewed political commitment to sustainable development, and elaborating on the two main themes of the conference: green economy within the context of sustainable development and poverty eradication, and institutional framework for sustainable development.

In 2004, Ambassador Ashe was elected Chairman of the thirteenth session of the United Nations Commission on Sustainable Development (CSD-13), the body responsible for reviewing progress on the implementation of Agenda 21 and Rio Declaration of Environment and Development, as well as providing policy guidance on the follow-up of the JPOI at the local, national, regional and international levels. Ambassador Ashe has also served President of the Executive Board of UNDP/UNFPA in 2010 and will serve as President of Executive Board of UNICEF in 2012. In addition to the above, Ambassador Ashe has also served on the governing bodies of all major UN environmental agreements, including serving as the first Chairman of the Executive Board of the Clean Development Mechanism of the Kyoto Protocol of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), and Chairman of UNFCCC's Subsidiary Body on Implementation and Chairman of the Ad Hoc Working Group on Further Commitments under the Kyoto Protocol (AWG-KP) ; he has also chaired key negotiating processes within the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD).

In 2005, Ambassador Ashe was unanimously elected by the General Assembly of the United Nations to serve as Chairman of its Fifth Committee, the main committee of the General Assembly entrusted with responsibilities for administration and budgetary matters, and he successfully presided over the negotiations on the United Nations 2006-2007 biennial budget.

In 2008 Ambassador Ashe assumed the Chairmanship of the New York chapter of Group of 77 and China (G77), at the ambassadorial level. The G77 consists of over 130 developing countries that are members of the United Nations and is the largest Third World coalition in the United Nations system. It provides the means for the developing world to articulate and promote its collective economic interests and enhance its joint negotiating capacity on all major international economic issues in the United Nations system, and promote economic and technical cooperation among developing countries (ECDA/TCDC). As Chairman, Ambassador Ashe was the face and voice of the Group and was responsible for overseeing and delivering all of the Group's statements and sponsoring and negotiating resolutions and decisions at all UN global conferences and other meetings dealing with international economic cooperation and development.

In 2007, Ambassador Ashe was awarded a Companion of the Order of St Michael and St George (CMG) by Queen Elizabeth II of England, in recognition of his global diplomatic services.

In 2013 Ambassador Ashe will achieve the highest accolade accorded to a UN diplomat when he will be elected President of the 68th session United Nations General Assembly, which begins in September 2013.
