MIFTAAH SEMINAR REVIVING THE HEART



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Adhere to the Way of the Prophet SAW

- Ibn Ata'illah continues by saying: Neglect will find no way to you except through your own negligence in following the example of the Prophet SAW.
 - He is essentially saying that there will be no true spiritual revival, except if you adhere to the way of the Prophet SAW.
 - The kalima, la ilaha illallah, is the key that gets us into Jannah, and the grooves on that key are the Prophet Muhammad SAW.
 - We are not the only community that says la ilaha illallah, but what makes us different is the sunnah of the Prophet SAW.
- Allah SWT tells us in the Qur'an: "Say, O Prophet, 'If you love Allah, then follow me; Allah will love you and forgive your sins." {3:31}
 - Sunnah is not simply how you eat or what you wear.
 - Although these are important sunnan, the purpose is to make you an object of Divine Love.

- Following the Prophet SAW takes two forms: The outward form and the hidden form.
 - If it weren't for the Companions, we would not know how the Prophet SAW wanted us to pray, fast, how to pay our zakat, how to make hajj, etc.
 - The inward worship, however, is much more difficult to realize.
 - When Allah SWT says "truly God loves" in the Qur'an, the object of God's Love is never the Angels or the Ka'aba, but rather it is always a set of people who have any number of seven qualities.
- Allah mentions in the Quran that He loves:
 - Taqwa piety, God-consciousness
 - Tahara cleanliness, inward & outward
 - Tawba repentance, those that return to Him
 - Tawakkul reliance upon God
 - Qist those who are just in their dealings
 - Sabr the patient
 - Ihsaan spiritual excellence
- The Prophet SAW is the perfect example of these qualities.
 - If we embody just one of these qualities, Allah SWT loves us, so it is unimaginable how much He loved the Prophet SAW who embodied all 7 qualities.
- Later in this book, Ibn Ata'illah says to view sins not as breaking a rule, but view your sins as if you are breaking a covenant of love.

- We have a covenant of love with Allah SWT and when we sin, we do not reflect that covenant of love.
- Ibn Ata'illah states: The inward sunnah of the Prophet SAW is to intend to connect with Allah SWT in your prayer.
- Prayer is something which is done outwardly.
- If one prays while doing the outward actions, they have technically fulfilled their prayer.
- However, we have to fulfill more than just the outward conditions of prayer to pray as the Prophet SAW did.
- He SAW said: The coolness of my eye (meaning 'my heart's delight') is in prayer.
- If you do not feel the inward process, ask Allah SWT to help you with your focus.
- Ibn Ata'illah explains that a person who prays and does not experience the sunnah of inward connection with Allah is like a sick person who is so ill that even sugar has acquired a bitter taste in their mouth.
- This person must work on relieving that inward illness which is preventing them from tasting the sweetness of salah.
- This illness will be relieved by continuing to pray.
- The power of this pillar of our religion is such that it works whether you realize it or not.

- Ibn Abbas RA narrated that the Prophet SAW said: A person does not get anything from his prayer except that which he is conscious of.
- The second thing which Ibn Ata'illah mentions in terms of inward sunnahs of the Prophet SAW is to read the Quran with tadabur (reflection).
- When reading the Quran, we should take moments to pause and reflect on the meaning of what we are reading.
 - Think about Jennah or Jahanam
 - Think about characteristics of those mentioned in the Quran.
- One of the worst signs of misguidance is that a person reads something about character and thinks about someone else.
- The Quran was sent down in Arabic because that was the language of the people of that time and the Quran was sent to be understood by them.
 - Even if we can not understand Arabic, it is our responsibility to find a translation which we are able to understand so that we are able to form a connection with the Quran.
