6. Interrogative Adverbs (used to ask a question)

eg Why are you so late?
↓
Interrogative adverb

When does the train arrive?
↓
Interrogative adverb

7. Adverbs of affirmation, negation (express assertion or negation)

eg He will surely give you money.
↓
adverb of affirmation

I have never seen him.
↓
adverb of negation

8. Exclamatory adverbs (express degree or extent in exclamations)

eg How tall the tower is!
↓
Exclamatory adverb

What a tall tree it is!
↓
Exclamatory adverb

9. Relative adverbs - (relate or refer back to their antecedent)

eg The seat where we sat is still free.
↓ ↓
antecedent relative adverb
