INVEST IN ENERGY EFFICIENCY

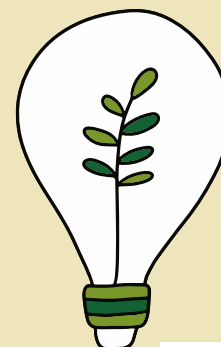
