Use these words to fill in the blanks: * משה * 40 * loved *

IN THE PARSHA:

The גמרא tells a story of a בייתוסי who was arguing with רי יוחנן בן זכאי.

While <u>we</u> know that on the 2nd day of פסח we begin counting ספירת העומר for 49 days, and the 50th day is שבועות, no matter what day of the week it is, this בייתוסי was trying to prove that שבועות is always on a Sunday.

He said that since משה loved the Jewish people, and שבועות is only one day, משה would arrange the calendar in a way that שבועות is always on a Sunday, giving the Jewish people 2 days of rest and pleasure in a row.

בייתוסי told the בייתוסי, What you're saying makes no sense! If _____ loved the Jewish people so much, why would he keep them in the desert for ____ years!? (He quoted a פרשה from this week's פרשה, describing how short the trip from הר סיני to the border of ארץ ישראל was. It would normally take 11 days, and they traveled it in only 3 days).

QUESTION:

Why did משה 'use the word "if" משה loved the Jewish people? The בייתוסי had said that משה did love the Jewish people. How was רי יוחנן בן זכאי responding to this?

Answer:

Of course משה רבנו the Jewish people!

בייתוסי was saying that the בייתוסי didn't understand how משה showed that love.

The fact that משה loves the Jewish people doesn't mean that he always does what's

<u>easier</u> for them. Rather, because he loves them, he does what is <u>better</u> for them.

Further discussion:

How would being in the מדבר for 40 years be **better** for the Jewish people?
