## IN THE PARSHA:

In this week's Parsha, we learn about the \_\_\_\_\_ that Hashem provided for the Jewish people when they were in the desert.

At that time, ברכת המזון instituted the ברכה of ייהזןיי – the 1<sup>st</sup> ברכה of ברכה – with which the Jewish people would thank Hashem for the מן.

## **QUESTION:**

While we eat food that comes through work, "ילחם מן הארץ, the מן simply came from heaven, "ילחם מן השמים".

# Answer / Life Lesson:

The truth is that even the food that we eat – like everything that we have – comes only and directly from Hashem.
