IN THE PARSHA:

This week we once again begin to read the תורה from the beginning.
The 1st word in the תורה is
The 1st letter in the תורה is the letter
QUESTION:
Since the letter א is the letter in the א-ב, why does the תורה begin with the
letter ב which is the letter of the ב־?

ANSWER:

The reason that the תורה begins with the 2nd letter of the א-ב is because there is something that comes first, before we begin to read the written words.

Even before we begin to learn and understand the words of the תורה, there is something else we need to remember and know.

We first need to remember that we are learning Hashem's תורה, and when we learn his תורה we connect to Him, the נותן התורה.

This is why the תורה begins with the second letter of the א-ב.

When we see that the תורה begins with the <u>second</u> letter of the א-ב, it reminds us that there is something else that comes <u>first</u>. First we must know that we are learning Hashem's תורה, and connecting with Him.
