IN THE PARSHA:

After אָל-אָבִי revealed his true identity to his brothers, he told them אָל-אָבִי – they should _____ and tell אעקב to come down to מצרים where he would provide for him and the rest of his family for the remaining five years of the famine.

QUESTION:

Why did ייסף tell them _____ – that they should <u>hurry</u>?

ONE ANSWER:

For _____ years, יעקב was in constant pain, mourning the loss of his beloved son, יוסף.

יוסף knew that this was a punishment for the 22 years that _____ was away from his own parents, יצחק and רבקה.

Now, however, the 22 years were up. There was no more need for this pain. Every extra minute of pain was unnecessary, and had to be avoided.

Therefore, _______ told his brothers to hurry, so יעקב should not suffer an extra moment.

LIFE LESSON:

Sometimes there may be a situation that requires one to be harsh with another person. Even if that might be the case, one must keep it to the barest minimum, and only what is absolutely ______.

Just as יוסף ensured that his father wouldn't have to suffer any longer than necessary, we must make sure to always treat others in the best possible way (ימין מקרבת).

Further discussion:

Why does אבי say מהרו אל אבי hurry to <u>my</u> father, and not מהרו אל אבי harry to <u>our</u> father? (See שיחה in the שיחה)
