Hall Master Message



I first want to start off by saying that it has been a pleasure to have you stay with us in Hall 4 this year. Year after year, this student residence has been a wonderful place for students from all parts of the globe to come together and share the amazing experience of university life together. Regrettably, the past year has not been kind to Hong Kong. From the massive social demonstrations last year to the widespread Covid-19 epidemic this year, these turbulent times have inevitably caused disruptions to our hall life in Hall 4.

In Semester A, when the social demonstrations began to take place across university campuses in Hong Kong, including City U, the university had to make the difficult decision of shutting down the student residence in November in order to ensure the safety and well-being of our residents and staff. Different levels of damages were found at the student residence and lots of restoration work were needed before the re-opening of the student residence on December 12, 2019. It was a happy moment when I moved back to the hall and I believe our residents felt the same too.

Transitioning into 2020, I had high hopes that life for students would return back to normal. Yet no one could expect that less than a month into semester, COVID-19 had already spread its way into Hong Kong, prompting the halt of in-class teaching and with it any hope of normality. Many students especially non-local students have had to make the difficult decision of whether they should take the option of the early check-out and get the partial refund of the hall fee. In this difficult period, it is encouraging that 7 out of the 8 residence tutors (RTs) remained in Hall 4 to provide their support and care to those who chose to continue living at the hall. Due to the epidemic, the remaining RT was unable to return to Hong Kong after returning home to Mainland China during the Chinese New Year. Nevertheless, she continued to work remotely and her work has been highly recognized and commended by our RT team. Our Residents' Association (RA) also worked diligently for our hall during the difficult time. Although their planned activities in February and March were cancelled due to the epidemic, they kept up their spirits and thoroughly performed the preparation work for the pre-OCamp and OCamp. In addition, our RA Councilor was proactive in supporting the hall by providing very useful opinions and suggestions. Having such a wonderful Hall Management Team makes me feel very fortunate and blessed.



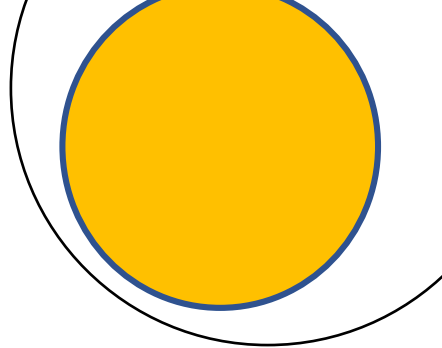
As Hong Kong continues to tackle the coronavirus, perhaps we can draw from history for words of advice and words of hope. During the 2003 SARs epidemic, the people of Hong Kong displayed an extraordinary amount of resilience and strength in fighting the virus. Seventeen years later, we continue to do the same. 

Lastly, I would like to thank all my RA members for always supporting and encouraging me during the tough moments.



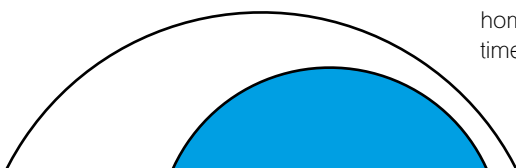

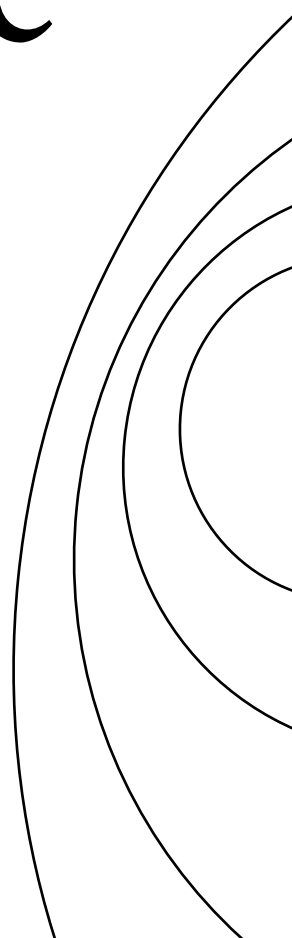

Eugene

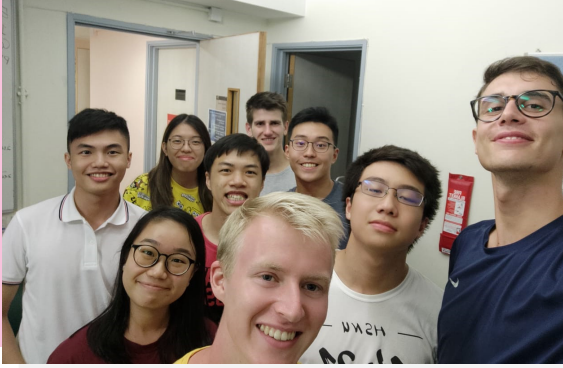



各偵探還原真相後，便隨組爸媽的腳步回到呵科稍作休息及準備玩房間遊戲至凌晨。

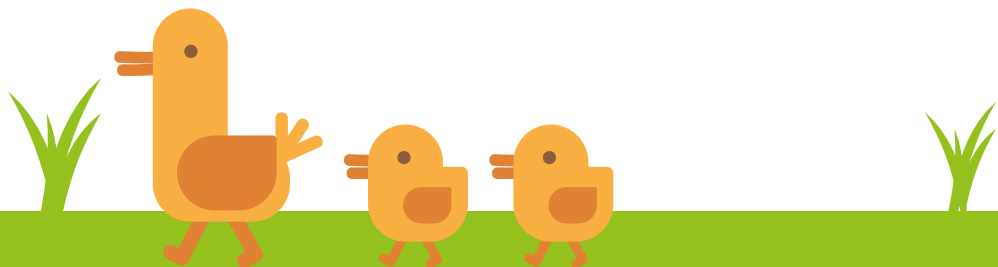
九月十四日

新學期茶敘會

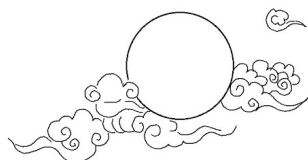

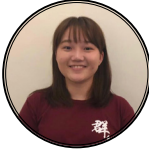
