BARRINGTON ON THE PARK

At Prospect St and Mulock Dr, New Market

The site is located North of Mulock Drive off Prospect Street, which is the extension of Bayview Avenue in New Market.

Overall Feng Shui (Geomancy) Setting

This property belongs to the World-Cycle of “8” (2004-2023). It backs on the South (double “8”), fronts on the North (“7-9-4” setting) and enters via the North. This setting will ensure a good life cycle of 100 years. That is, people living there will enjoy relatively good health and income.

This property is hidden away from the busy Mulock Drive on the South and private housing on both the North and the East. There is a park with very tranquilizing energy not far away at the North-West side of the property. The tranquility is further enhanced by the historic and clean setting of a nearby area of “Old New Market”. Surrounding good energies also contribute to the well-being of the property.

Houses in this development include all four orientations: South, North, East and West. From the Feng Shui point of view, this site is defined as a “South Backing” property. It is sitting on flat ground without having the worry of wrong altitudes. Let us examine the Feng Shui powers of the four boundaries.

The South Boundary – the Back Support

This is the support portion of the property. Support for a property should be higher (like an armchair supporting the person sitting). In nature, it is represented by mountain ranges. In modern urban area, it may be represented with buildings and/or streets. The south end of Barrington borders on Pickering College, which is a prestigious school. It sits on high ground which forms proper back support to the property and is good for retaining wealth.

The North Boundary – the Frontage

The frontage of a property is like a lake which collects water from incoming rivers. (Water means money.) Hence it should be lower and open. The north end of Barrington fronts on Pearson Street which is situated lower than Pickering College. Hence it is capable of collecting good incoming energy.

The West Boundary – the “Dragon”

Since Barrington is a “South Sitting” property, the “dragon” (West) boundary should be on a more major street and preferably higher than the right property end. Indeed, Prospect Street runs like a dragon on the west side of the premises and higher the east end of the property. It would enhance both authority and prosperity.

The East Boundary – the “Tiger”

Since Barrington is “North Sitting”, the “tiger” (east) boundary is preferred to be lower than the east. Indeed, its east boundary is sitting off another subdivision which is sitting at a much lower level.

Interior Street Settings


Houses in the Barrington project are divided into 4 distinctive blocks, with streets winding around them. These streets resemble rivers, which carry and deliver energies to the property. Ample trees and green are strategically positioned to as to further enhance life energies. This is obviously a form of good Feng Shui.

House Designs

Every house model has been designed and revised to comply with common Feng Shui practice. Highlights are as follows:

- External building shapes are elegant and inviting, totally void of any “axe” shapes and corners.
- Every model is designed with the “open concept” in mind. Its main entrance is devised to allow a wide and open foyer. If the incoming energy were a river, the foyer would be the lake. A wide lake can surely hold more water than a small one. And “water” means “money”.
- Neither stairs nor powder room door would ever run against the main entrance.
- No sharp wall corners against the main entrance.
- Front entrance and patio door would not run into a straight line.
- Kitchens are carefully designed so that no sink would ever confront the stove.
- Bathroom on the second floor would never have its toilet directly above the main entrance.
- Head of bed in master bedroom would never be directly above the kitchen stove.

With the above observations, Barrington Homes is Feng Shui approved.
