SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER: *DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY (YEAR A)*

“Sunday of Divine Mercy” celebrates God’s mercy and the hope we receive through Christ’s resurrection. The readings highlight forgiveness, faith, and the joy of new life in Christ.

- **God’s Mercy and Forgiveness:** Jesus gives His disciples the power to forgive sins, showing God’s endless mercy. This gift invites us to seek forgiveness and extend mercy to others.
- **Faith Amid Doubt:** Thomas doubts the resurrection until he sees Jesus’ wounds. His journey shows that faith can grow through questions and honest seeking.
- **Peace Through Christ:** Jesus greets His disciples with peace, calming their fear. His presence brings peace that conquers fear and doubt.
- **The Power of Community:** The early Christians prayed, shared resources, and grew together in faith. This shows the importance of supporting each other in living out the Gospel.
- **Hope Through Resurrection:** Christ’s resurrection gives us a living hope and an eternal inheritance. This hope sustains us, even through trials and challenges.
- **Joy in Belief:** Although we cannot see Jesus, faith brings joy and purpose. Believing without seeing is blessed, as Jesus teaches Thomas.

“Divine Mercy Sunday” (Year A) invites us to embrace God’s mercy and live in hope and faith. It calls us to be merciful, to believe with joy, and to support each other as a community of believers.

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR A): CHRIST OUR STRENGTH AND COURAGE

As the great Easter fire of the Easter Vigil is replaced by sunrise on Easter morning, the Great 50 Days of the Easter Season have begun. These 90 days are marked by profound joy and gratitude, expressed often in many shouts of "Alleluia! Alleluia!", as the whole Church experiences the Crucified and Risen Christ alive and in our midst. The pattern of the readings for the Easter Season is a unique one: the first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles and describes the life and growth of the early Church, witnessing to faith in Jesus' Resurrection. The second reading also powerfully reflects the Easter themes: we hear passages from the pastoral letter First Peter which was written as an instruction to the newly baptized. The Easter Season relies on readings from the Gospel of John interspersed with those from Luke's Gospel. We come to know the Risen Lord in the peace he brings, in the conversation on the road to Emmaus, in the catch of a large number of fish, and in his call to Peter to tend his sheep. This Risen Lord is the gate and the way, the truth, and the life. May the peace which Jesus grants all his disciples fill your hearts and minds during these Great 50 Days.

The Gospel John 20:19 - 31 This passage is proclaimed every Second Sunday of Easter, no matter what year it is. It recounts two Easter appearances to the disciples. The Risen Jesus appears on the first day of the week. Fear and locked doors are dispelled by Jesus who stands in their midst and grants them his peace. He shows them his hands and his side, now marked by his wounds made glorious. He commissions them to a ministry of reconciliation and forgiveness. One week later, Jesus appears again. This time Thomas is with them. Upon experiencing the Risen Jesus for himself, he responds with the strongest affirmation of Jesus' identity in the entire Gospel: "My Lord and my God!" Thomas believes because he has seen. Jesus reminds him that truly blessed are all those who have not seen and yet believe. That includes us! We who have not seen and yet believe are made bold by Jesus' gifts of peace and the Holy Spirit to go into the world and proclaim the Father's love as his chosen disciples.

The First Reading Acts of the Apostles 2:42 - 47 This reading is a powerful description of the life of the early Church. Although it is idealized in its depiction of community life, it urges us to understand the significant ethical demands for those who are disciples of Christ. Notice the 4 elements of their life as the baptized community. First, "they devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles," learning the meaning of their Baptism. Second, they were devoted to "the communal life," aware that they committed to loving one another, and serving all in need. Third, they were devoted to "the breaking of the bread," one of names for the celebration of the Eucharist which occurred in their homes. Lastly, they devoted themselves to "the prayers." True to their Jewish heritage, they prayed several times throughout the day, both alone and with others. These "prayers" will eventually become the Liturgy of the Hours, especially Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer. These 4 elements together paint a vivid picture of the early Church and explain why so many people were drawn to their life in Christ.

The Second Reading 1 Peter 1:3 - 9 This reading helps of all us baptized understand our "new birth to a living hope through the Resurrection of Jesus Christ." We have not seen Christ but we know him and love him and follow him, with his gifts of great joy even in the midst of whatever trials we suffer. Christ is truly risen!

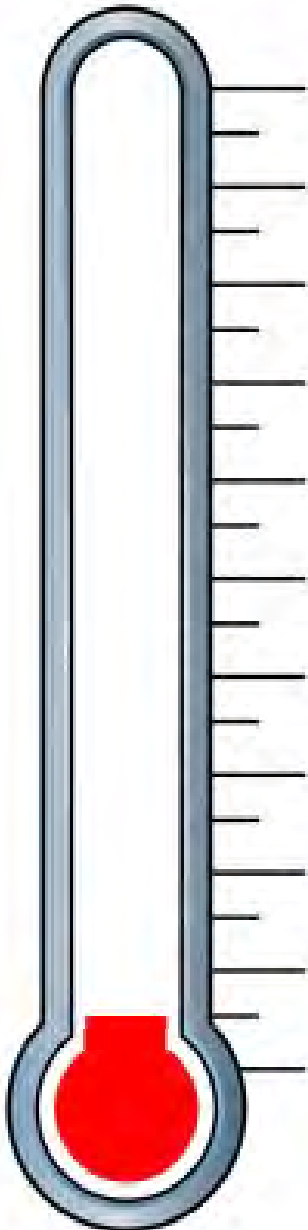

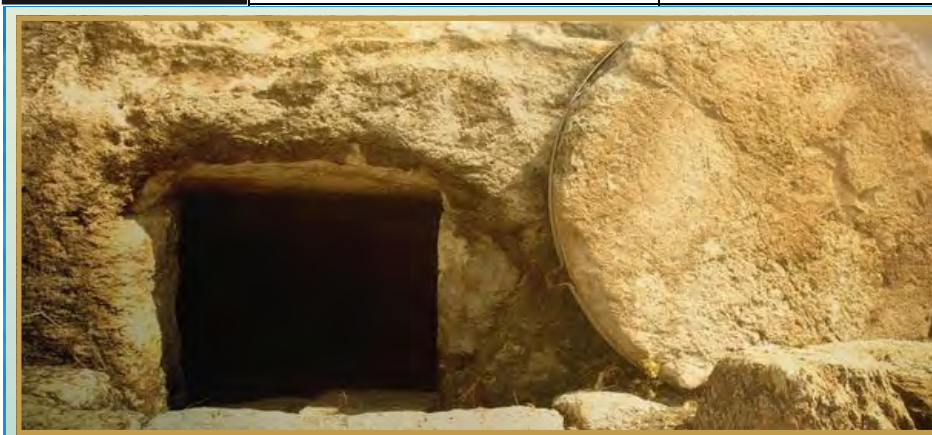

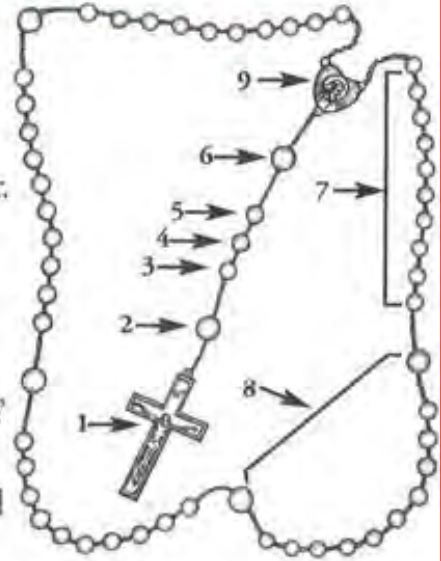

HOW TO PRAY THE CHAPLET OF THE DIVINE MERCY

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
2. Say the optional Opening Prayer.
3. Say the "Our Father."
4. Say the "Hail Mary."
5. Say the Apostles' Creed.
6. Say the "Eternal Father."
7. Say 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" on the "Hail Mary" beads.
8. Repeat for four more decades, saying "Eternal Father" on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the Sake of His sorrowful Passion" on the following "Hail Mary" beads.
9. At the conclusion of the five decades, on the medallion say the "Holy God," the concluding doxology, three times.
10. Say the optional Closing Prayer.
