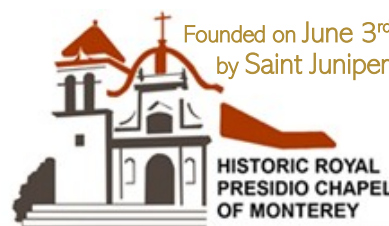

## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER *by young-catholics.com*

The 3rd Sunday of Easter, Year A, reflects on how the risen Jesus brings hope and understanding to His followers. The readings emphasize Jesus' presence, the importance of faith, and the fulfillment of God's plan.

- **Jesus' Presence in Our Journey:** The Gospel tells the story of Jesus walking with the disciples on the road to Emmaus. This shows that Jesus is with us in all moments of life, even when we do not recognize Him.
- **Scripture Reveals Christ:** Jesus explains the Scriptures to the disciples on the road. This reminds us that the Bible helps us understand Jesus and strengthens our faith.
- **Faith Opens Our Eyes:** The disciples recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread. This shows that faith allows us to truly see Jesus in the Eucharist and in others.
- **God's Plan Fulfilled:** Peter's speech in Acts highlights how Jesus' death and resurrection were part of God's plan. This reminds us that God's promises are fulfilled through Jesus.
- **Hope in Christ's Resurrection:** Peter's letter speaks of hope through Jesus' resurrection. This hope encourages us to live with trust, knowing Christ has conquered death.
- **Eucharist as Spiritual Nourishment:** The Gospel shows the disciples' joy in sharing a meal with the risen Jesus. It reflects how the Eucharist nourishes and unites us with Christ today.

The themes this weekend invite us to recognize Jesus in the Scriptures, in the Eucharist, and in our daily lives. The risen Jesus continues to guide, teach, and give hope to all who seek Him.

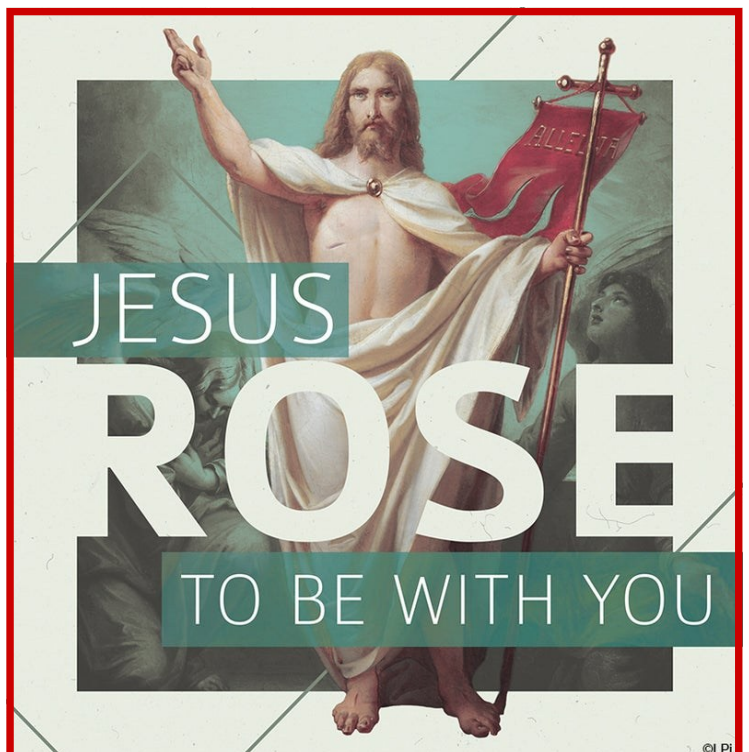

## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR A): RECOGNIZED IN BREAK BROKEN

The Easter Season is given the name “the Great 50 Days.” Each weekday from Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday is given the same status as a Sunday; each day is a celebration to the fullest of our new life in Christ as we give thanks for the blessings of the presence of the newly-baptized, the “neophytes,” in our midst. Each day is full of “alleluias!” In the ancient Church during these Great 50 Days, there was no fasting at all, not even on Friday, and there was no kneeling. Since standing is the posture of “resurrection,” no one knelt during any community prayer for the whole 90 days. It is the Season that begins the new creation begun by Jesus at his resurrection, the new creation which will see him adored and glorified as Lord of all life, Lord of every human heart, Lord of the cosmos. The fullness experience of our redemption has begun in him – for each of us individually and for the whole human family. We will also rise and live forever in him. Alleluia!

**The Gospel Luke 24:13 - 35** In today’s Gospel we hear one of the most beloved accounts of the Crucified and Risen Jesus as he accompanies two of his disciples along the road to Emmaus. (Are these two male disciples? Is this a married couple who invite Jesus in their home to share a meal? Only one name is given, the male name Cleopas.) Even though the great news had been shared with them that others had seen the empty tomb and the angels who explained it, these two disciples don’t believe the news and have given up all hope. Jesus himself appears to them, as they walk away from Jerusalem, full of discouragement. He leads them through examples throughout Scripture, all of which refer to himself and his mission as Messiah and Lord. Still unrecognized by them, Jesus stays to eat with them, and in the act of praying the blessing to God over the bread of the meal as he had done at the Last Supper, their eyes are opened! They recognize the Holy One who has been with them all the while. With hearts burning within them, they return to Jerusalem and to the disciples gathered together there. They immediately hear how Jesus has appeared to other disciples and they tell their story of how they recognized him “in the breaking of the bread,” that is, in the celebration of the Eucharist. We too are so blessed to have both of these sacred treasures in our midst: the Scriptures and the Eucharist. We too recognize Jesus, our Lord and our God, in so many ways, but especially in those same two elements: the Scriptures and the Eucharist. He is risen, in our midst, and permanently present to us always.

**The First Reading Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 22 - 33** On the day of Pentecost, filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter stands up and witnesses to the Risen Jesus whom he has encountered in person. Peter speaks bluntly to his audience, not to condemn them but to convince them that Jesus indeed has overcome death, is now permanently present in our midst, and who also offers to those who believe in him the same gift of eternal life. Peter uses the example of the Prophet David, so rightly revered by the Jewish people. David died and was buried just as Jesus was, but Jesus as Son of God was raised from the dead and is now the source of the life-giving Spirit for all people.

**The Second Reading 1 Peter 1:17 -- 21** In today’s Second Reading, we continue to hear from the First Letter of Peter. He calls for behavior that is consistent with the new status we have received through the blood of Christ. It was this “precious blood of Christ” that has freed us from death and centered on our life in God. What a powerful image for us to have in mind as we come forward to drink his blood, the blood of new and eternal covenant, the blood that saves us from sin and death.

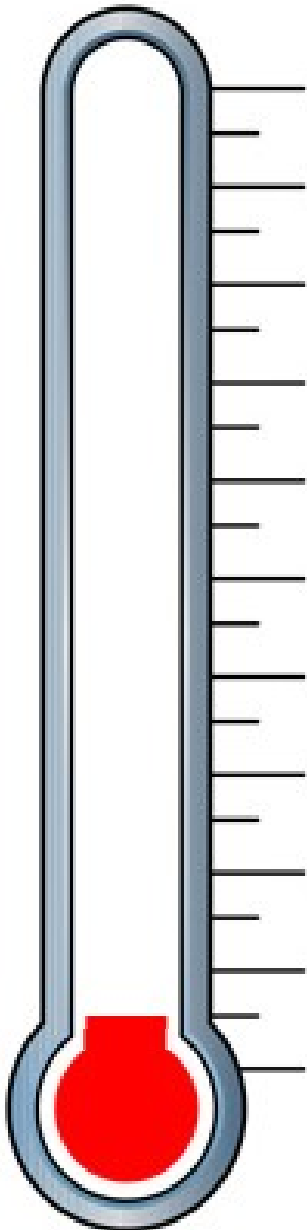

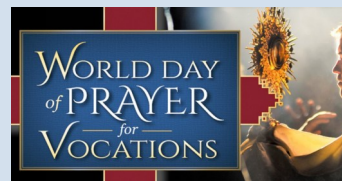

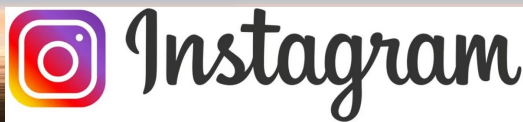
