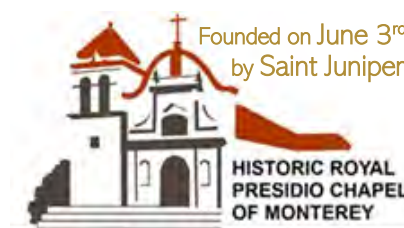

- **Transformation and Conversion:** Reflecting on the transformative power of Jesus' resurrection, Easter encourages believers to turn away from sin and embrace a life transformed by God's grace.
- **Divine Mercy:** Particularly highlighted on the Second Sunday of Easter, this theme focuses on God's infinite mercy and love, inviting believers to trust in Jesus' message of mercy and to act mercifully towards others.

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD (YEAR A): HE SAW AND BELIEVED

The Paschal Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ is a reality that is permanently present. Because of our Baptism, we encounter this great Mystery in a most intense way throughout the Three Great Days of the Easter Triduum. These three days are counted in the Jewish fashion: the first day is Holy Thursday sunset to Good Friday sunset; the second day is Good Friday sunset to Holy Saturday sunset; and today is the third day: Holy Saturday sunset which brought us to the fire, the Word, the baptismal water and sacred chrism, and the Eucharist of the Easter Vigil. This third day ends tonight at sunset Easter Sunday. The tremendous joy resounding through the entire world continues in its fullness through the next 50 days of the Easter Season. We are especially grateful for the gifts of the newly-baptized in our midst. Their new name (after being called "catechumens" and then "elect") is "neophyte," meaning "new sprout" – those reborn in Christ and made a new creation. We too celebrate the blessings of the Triduum by renewing our baptismal vows before the face of God and one another. Then filled once again by the Holy Spirit of the Crucified and Risen Christ, we commit ourselves to be partners with him in the daily dying and rising which is his life and which is ours – for the life of the world. May these Great 50 Days of Easter joy fill you, your family, and friends with abundant blessings!

The Gospel John 20:1 - 9 In John's Gospel, Mary Magdalen is a faithful follower of Jesus and, along with Jesus' Mother and other women, was a witness to his crucifixion and burial. We see in this reading that she was the first to discover the empty tomb. She believed Jesus' body had been stolen, and ran to report the news to Peter and John. They both rush to the tomb, with John arriving first, and out of respect, he waits for Peter to enter the tomb first. Here John's Gospel presents us two very different responses to what they experience in the tomb. They both see the burial clothes lying folded neatly, which refuted any claim that Jesus' body was stolen. Peter though is slow to understand the meaning of the empty tomb, but John "saw and believed." John encourages us too to deepen our faith, that even though we may not always see, we can come to believe that Jesus is truly risen from the dead and in our midst always.

The First Reading Acts of the Apostles 10:34a, 37 - 43 This reading shares with us Peter's homily in the house of Cornelius the centurion. These two men were deeply moved when they met for the first time. Cornelius had had a vision in which he was told to send for Peter. Peter came, learned of what had happened, and responded with the catechesis that forms today's reading. Cornelius' vision and conversion mark a major turning point for Peter and the entire Church, for the Holy Spirit is clearly pointing out the direction the Church should take in welcoming non-Jews into the Body of Christ. The Church's mission is absolutely universal.

The Second Reading Colossians 3:1 - 4 As this reading points out, for baptized Christians like us, the resurrection of Jesus is not merely an historical event; it affects us personally as we truly encounter Jesus crucified and risen and in our midst now and every day. The fact of the resurrection and the demands it makes on us are felt every day since we too are raised with Christ. We have died with Christ by our Baptism and so must live a new life with him, trusting that we will "appear with him in glory" when we see him face to face.

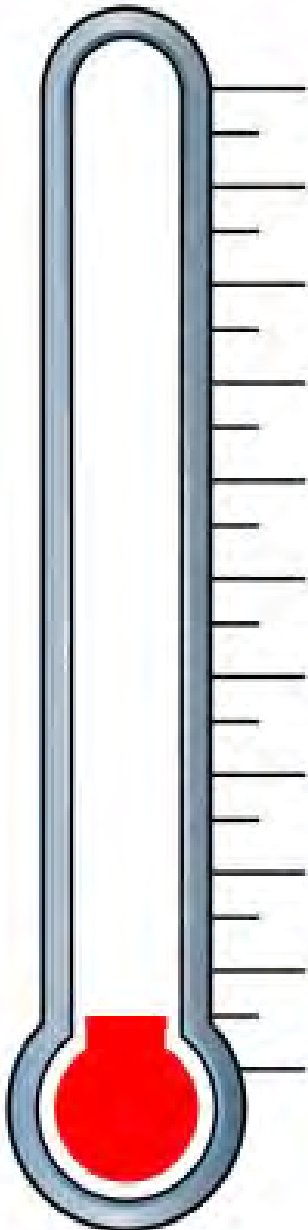

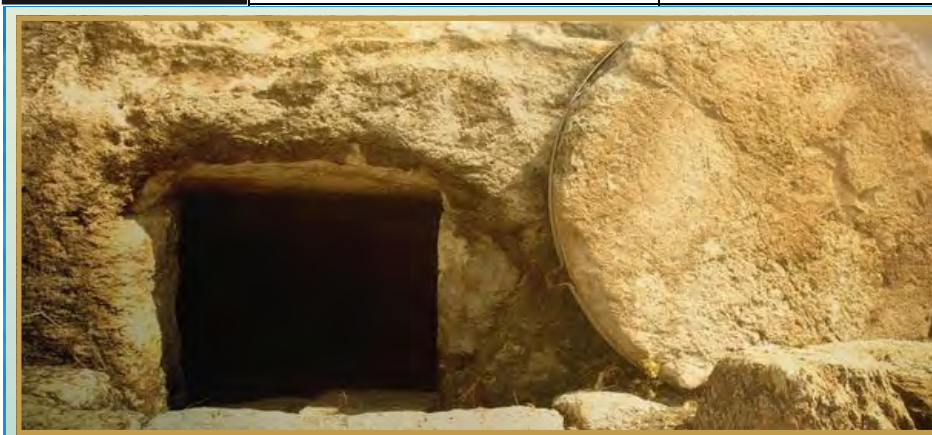
