

The Third Sunday of Advent (Year A) *by young-catholics.com*

The 4th Sunday of Advent Year A continues a time of waiting and hope. The readings show God's promise, Jesus' coming, and our call to trust.

- God's Promise:** God promises a sign through Isaiah, showing He is with His people. Jesus' birth is the fulfillment of that promise.
- Faith and Trust:** Ahaz struggles to trust God, but Joseph listens and obeys. Faith means believing even when we do not fully understand.
- Jesus as Emmanuel:** The name Emmanuel means "God is with us." Jesus comes to be close to His people and bring them hope.
- Obedience to God:** Joseph follows God's message despite fear and uncertainty. Trusting God often requires action, even when it is hard.
- God's Plan for Salvation:** Paul reminds the Romans that Jesus' coming is part of God's plan. Salvation is a gift meant for all people.
- Hope in Waiting:** Advent is a time of waiting for Jesus. The readings remind us that God's plan unfolds in His time.

Advent invites people to prepare for Jesus with faith and hope. The 4th Sunday of Advent Year A reminds us that God keeps His promises.



FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT (YEAR A) *by Sr. Sharon McMillan, SNDdeN*

The liturgy of Advent, after focusing on Christ's coming at the end of time, now draws us into the events of the coming birth of the Lord. One vivid prayer that may help us see this truth with the eyes of faith is the Second Preface of Advent which reads in part: "For all the oracles of the prophets foretold him, the Virgin Mother longed for him with love beyond all telling, John the Baptist sang of his coming and proclaimed his presence when he came. It is by his gift that already we rejoice at the mystery of his Nativity, so that he may find us watchful in prayer and exultant in his praise." Listen for this prayer just before the "Holy, Holy, Holy." The Church invites us to reflect on God's marvelous plan by which the Word became flesh and by which each of us (and every human being) may rejoice at the good news of the Messiah's conception and birth. The Child to be born is Emmanuel, God with us. O come, Emmanuel!

The First Reading Isaiah 7:10 - 14 In 736 BC, Assyria is threatening to take over the whole region. Some counsel the king, Ahaz, to join the coalition against Assyria; others, most notably Isaiah, tell him not to do a thing. Through Isaiah, God offers Ahaz a sign of hope, but Ahaz, in a show of false piety, refuses the offer. God offers the sign anyway: Jerusalem will be saved, and the sign of hope is the birth of a child, God's concrete sign of compassion for the people. Just as the birth of Emmanuel was a sign of promise to Ahaz, so the birth of Jesus is a concrete sign of God's unfailing love for all the world.

The Second Reading Romans 1:1 - 7 St. Paul had not yet visited the Christian community in Rome, so he begins his letter to them with a summary of his Gospel as a way to introduce himself. He writes to them as a slave and servant of Jesus Christ. Paul reminds them (and us) that the promise fulfilled in the coming of Jesus is the fulfillment of the age-old hope first proclaimed by the prophets. By emphasizing the Spirit and power of God at work in Jesus, Paul reminds us that the coming of Jesus involves not just his birth but his life, Death, and Resurrection. In the flesh, Jesus is Son of David, but in the Spirit, he is truly Son of God.


The Gospel Matthew 1:18 - 24 We are all familiar with the Annunciation to the Blessed Mother by the angel Gabriel, and we would recognize many of the magnificent art works which offer images of this event. But Matthew's Gospel presents the "Annunciation to Joseph" in a dream as he was struggling with what his response is to be after he learns of Mary's pregnancy. Matthew's Gospel presents us with the figure of Joseph who is just but also compassionate. He and Mary have already been betrothed but not yet wed. Since Joseph knows he is not the father of this child, he decides he cannot go ahead with the marriage. The law allows him to publically accuse Mary of adultery and have her stoned. Joseph is unwilling to treat Mary in this way, so he will "divorce her quietly" and so end their relationship. The angel of Lord reveals the truth to Joseph: the child has been conceived through the Holy Spirit. Joseph himself is to name the child "Jesus" (thus becoming by law Jesus' legal father, not foster father). Matthew is proclaiming the truth that one can be a law-observant Jew and a genuine Christian. Being faithful to the Torah will bring you to Jesus as the fulfillment of all that the Jewish people longed for. Matthew shows us through this Gospel that Jesus is Son of God through the Holy Spirit and Son of David through Jesus.


