

The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A) *by young-catholics.com*

The 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time speaks about humility and trust in God. The readings show how God chooses the lowly and blesses those who follow His ways.

- **Seeking humility and justice:** Zephaniah calls people to be humble and do what is right. God cares for those who trust Him and live simply.
- **God lifts up the lowly:** Paul reminds the Corinthians that God often chooses those who seem weak or unimportant. This shows that human strength and status do not matter to God.
- **Trusting in God's wisdom:** Paul says that God's ways are different from human ways. Real wisdom comes from following Christ, not from human success.
- **Blessings for the poor in spirit:** In the Gospel, Jesus says that those who know they need God are blessed. They will receive the kingdom of heaven.
- **Peace and mercy matter:** Jesus blesses those who are peacemakers and show mercy. God's children act with kindness and work for peace.
- **Suffering for doing right:** Jesus teaches that those who face trouble for following Him will be rewarded. God sees their struggles and will bless them.

The 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time reminds people to trust God and live simply. God blesses those who seek Him, show mercy, and stand firm in their faith.

THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A)

Although the Christmas Season ended only a few weeks ago (January 11), and the Sundays of Ordinary Time have barely begun, only two more Sundays remain after today until the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday (February 18)! That day begins what the Church calls “the Great 90 Days” which are the 40 days of the sacred Lenten Season, the Great Three Days of the Easter Triduum, and the 50 days of the Easter Season which concludes with the Feast of Pentecost. Then the weeks of Ordinary Time will begin again with May 25th and the Eighth Week, taking us eventually to the Feast of Christ the King at the end of November. The Gospel passages during the Sundays of this year (Year A) are taken in order from Matthew’s Gospel. Last Sunday’s Gospel saw Jesus beginning his public ministry after John the Baptist was arrested. Jesus begins with the words “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” He then calls his first disciples: Peter, Andrew, James, and John. In today’s reading, Matthew makes clear to all who hear and read this Gospel that Jesus is the new Moses, teaching with authority.

The Gospel Matthew 5:1 – 12a Today’s Gospel preaches a world turned inside out. This is not to say it claims poverty to be something good or that God’s blessing cannot be manifested in the gift of material things. But how difficult it can be to keep our hearts free in the midst of earthly possessions (and all that must be done to protect them). That is the point of the Beatitudes, the beginning of Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount. We hear Jesus particularly emphasize poverty of spirit, meekness, mourning, hunger and thirst, and persecution – in short, everything that represents weakness, everything that cultures and societies look down upon and so easily dismiss. Jesus invites us to examine our life and especially our value judgments in the light of the new values which he is describing to us. We can never meditate seriously enough on this great charter of the Christian life or ever be done with the attempt to implement it fully. Which beatitude do you find it easiest to agree with? Which one is the most challenging? What is your understanding of “the poor in spirit”?

The First Reading Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12 - 13 After choosing this Gospel reading of the Beatitudes, the biblical scholars of the late 1960s searched the Old Testament for a text that would be in harmony with this Gospel. They found it in the book of the Prophet Zephaniah who defines “the remnant of Israel” as the humble of the earth who seek justice and do no wrong. Who was Zephaniah? He prophesied in the land of Judah at the time when Babylon was soon to destroy Jerusalem and send the Israelites into exile. On that fateful day, Zephaniah hopes that God will discover several contrite lowly ones whose humility of heart will counter the pride of the people. Zephaniah calls for just such a conversion of heart as Jesus does in the Gospel.

The Second Reading 1 Corinthians 1:26 - 31 Although the Second Reading is a choice independent of the Gospel and First Reading, today’s Reading fits in very well with the focus of the other two. St. Paul fully grasped the inversion of values that the coming of Jesus Christ caused. From now on, God chooses what is weak in the world’s eyes. No one can boast of oneself before God. Apart from Jesus, nothing human is of value.


