

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord (Year A) *by young-catholics.com*

Epiphany is celebrated on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8. The feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord commemorates when Jesus Christ was revealed as the Messiah. The Gospel of Matthew recounts that three wise men from the East visited our savior after his birth and acknowledged him with gifts representing kingship, priesthood, and death. The Feast of the Epiphany highlights key themes in the story of Jesus and the visit of the Magi. These themes help us understand the importance of Jesus' birth and His mission for all people.

- **Jesus as Light:** Jesus is the light that shines in the darkness. He guides all people to God.
- **Universal Mission:** Jesus came for all nations and people. His salvation is not limited to one group.
- **Fulfillment of Prophecy:** Isaiah's prophecy about light and gifts is fulfilled in Jesus. The gifts of the Magi show this connection.
- **Humility and Kingship:** Jesus is a humble king. He shows true power through love and gentleness.
- **Inclusiveness:** Paul teaches that both Jews and Gentiles share in Jesus' promises. The Epiphany shows that everyone is included in God's plan.
- **Guidance of the Star:** The star leads the Magi to Jesus. This shows God's guidance to all who seek Him.
- **Gift-Giving:** The Magi bring gifts to honor Jesus. This shows recognition of His kingship and divinity.
- **Contrast with Herod:** Herod's fear and violence contrast with Jesus' humble birth. This shows the difference between earthly and heavenly kingship.

These themes remind us of the rich meaning of the Feast of the Epiphany. They invite us to reflect on Jesus' mission and our role in spreading His light.

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD (YEAR A)

Merry Christmas! Yes, I'll say it again: Merry Christmas! It is our joy as Catholics to celebrate Christmas as a full season, not merely one day, even though, as our cantor Arlala pointed out to me recently, the stores are now selling Valentines and Valentine's Day candies. For us, the Christmas glory and joy and hope continue through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which this year occurs on January 11th. And we continue singing Christmas carols through this entire Season, still surrounded by the beautiful Christmas trees, lights, and manger scene. The extraordinary, life-transforming reality of the Word made flesh that we hear so lovingly described in the Gospels of the Christmas/Epiphany Season is the beginning of what the Church calls "The Paschal Mystery" – that is, the entire reality of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ who is Emmanuel, God with us. The dawn of the Paschal Mystery is the birth of Jesus, a permanently present reality in our daily lives as we invite Jesus to be born in us.

The Gospel Matthew 2:1 – 12 The Christmas Gospel passages we have been hearing from the Gospel of Luke (with shepherds and angels surrounding the Holy Child in a manger) reveal to us the truths of the incarnation of the only Son of God who became a human being. The Epiphany passages from the Gospel of Matthew, on the other hand, emphasize how the truths of Jesus' birth were revealed to the world so that all might come and worship. In today's Gospel, we hear of Magi from the East (likely Persia) who arrive in Jerusalem to pay homage to the newborn King of the Jews. One of many theories about them is that Magi were men of wisdom who studied the stars; they discovered God's revelation for them in one unique star which led them to Jerusalem. As non-Jews, the Magi looked to Jewish leaders to further inform them of the exact location of this new King. In this Gospel text, Matthew powerfully highlights the startling paradox which grabs our attention. It is the Jewish leaders who were most familiar with God's Holy Word who see plainly what all the prophets have foretold – they should have been the first to follow the star and adore the Child. But it is those same Jewish leaders who refuse to believe and refuse to worship the newborn King. In fact, it is the king, the chief priests, and scribes who conspire against the Messiah and it is the wicked King Herod who decrees his death. It is the Gentile Magi who have come to worship, and with the help of the Jewish Scriptures, to find and adore him. This infancy story from Matthew is the essential Gospel (good news) in miniature: God became flesh and is truly present to us as God's beloved Son, our Brother Jesus. This revelation was an offense and contradiction to some, but salvation, light, and life to those who had eyes to see. The Magi are the forerunners of all those (like us!) who would come to worship the Risen Jesus proclaimed by the apostles.

The First Reading Isaiah 60:1 - 6 Christians recognize in the Prophet Isaiah's words the manifestation, the revelation, the epiphany of the divine truth we hear in today's Gospel. People of every nation will stream to God's holy city, just as the Magi did. They will recognize God's real presence in their midst – Jesus, our Emmanuel – and present to him the very best gifts they have: gold (for a king), frankincense (for worship), and myrrh (for one whose death is the source of our eternal life).

The Second Reading Ephesians 3:2 – 3a, 5 – 6 In this letter, St. Paul insists that the special, chosen status of the Jewish people is no longer exclusive to them. From the very beginning of creation, our loving God envisioned an extended, global family of brothers and sisters. We too are co-heirs and co-partners in the promises of God! Merry Christmas!

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Magi, Three Kings, Three Wise Men...
who were they?

Answer:

We sing songs, give gifts, and move three mysterious men into our manger scenes. There's a rich heritage in the Catholic Church of celebrating the magi, but their origins are steeped in mystery. The original Greek calls these men *magoi*. The word is translated elsewhere in Scripture to mean "magician," but a similar word was used in ancient history to describe an entirely different set of people altogether. In what is now modern-day Iran, the ruling empire had a wealthy priestly caste known as the Magi. At the time of Christ, the Magi formed one of the ruling councils of the Parthian Empire. These priests interpreted dreams and read the stars to anticipate major events that could affect the fortunes of the empire.

We're not exactly sure where the magi of the Gospels traveled from. Matthew simply says "the east." History tells us that the ancient regions of Persia, Assyria, and Babylon all had a magi priesthood at the time of Christ. Whichever region they hailed from, they likely traveled over one thousand miles over the course of several months to arrive at the Holy Family. Unfortunately for the classic song, there is no concrete evidence these men were themselves kings, though they did bear gifts "from afar" at the prompting of their astronomical calculations.






