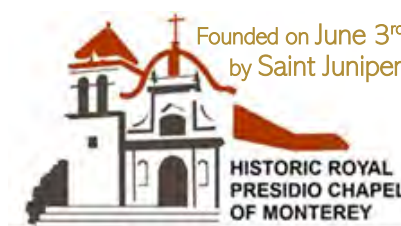

XI SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A focuses on God's love, mercy, and call to service. The readings show how God chooses His people, saves them, and sends them out to share His message.

- **God's chosen people:** God tells the Israelites that they are His special people. He reminds them of how He saved them and calls them to follow His ways.
- **Salvation through Jesus:** Jesus died for sinners, not for those who were already good. His love brings forgiveness and a new life with God.
- **God's mercy and compassion:** Jesus looks at the crowds and feels deep concern for them. He wants to help them and sends His disciples to do the same.
- **Mission of the disciples:** Jesus gives His disciples the power to heal and help others. He wants them to share what they have received.
- **Call to service:** Jesus tells His followers to care for people in need. He calls them to serve with love and generosity.
- **Obedience to God:** God asks the Israelites to listen to Him and keep His covenant. Following God's ways brings blessings and a closer relationship with Him.

The 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time this year reminds people that God loves them and calls them to live for Him. He saves, He forgives, and He sends His people out to help others.

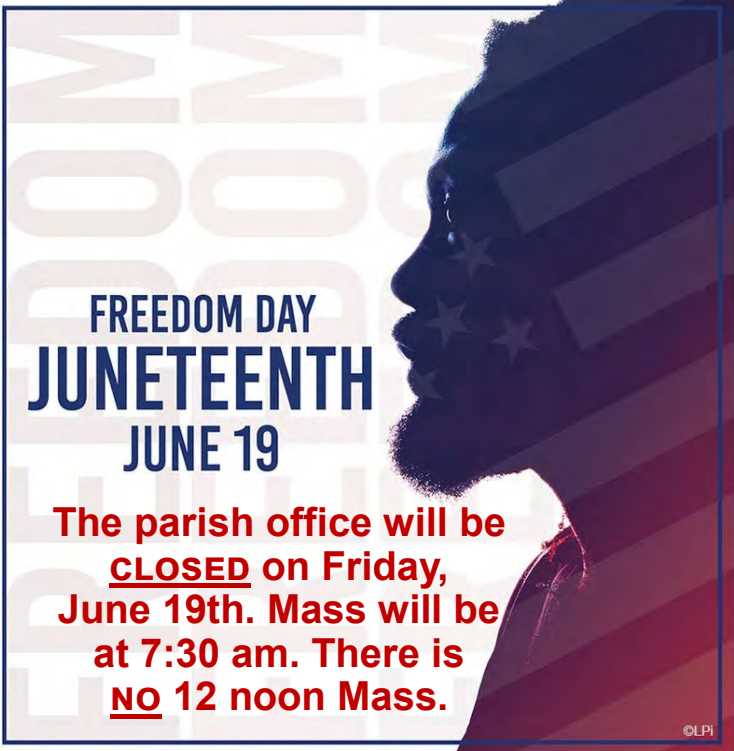

ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: A HOLY NATION

After the Great 90 days of the holy seasons of Lent and Easter, followed by the Feasts of the Most Holy Trinity and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Church Year returns to the Sundays of Ordinary Time. These Sundays which are not part of any season and which do not have names but numbers will take us all the way to Advent at the end of this November. The pattern for the Scripture readings during the Sundays of Ordinary Time takes the Gospel reading as its anchor. Since this is year A, the Gospel is taken from St. Matthew. The First Reading is then chosen from one of the many books of the Old Testament to be in harmony with that Gospel.

The Gospel Matthew 9:36 – 10:8

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses two vivid images for God's care for his people. His compassion for them is strong since they often seem to be as lost and troubled as sheep without a shepherd. The second image brings to mind God the Father as the "master of the harvest" and his people the beautiful and abundant harvest just waiting to be cared for. Jesus reminds us that the divine shepherd and the harvest master need human cooperation. Jesus chosen twelve ordinary men to be his apostles. The word "apostle" literally means one who is "sent out." These disciples Jesus called to share his authority and mission had no wealth, no special education, no social standing. Yet Jesus sent them forth to announce God's reign to the "lost sheep of the house of Israel." The miracles that accompanied their proclamation were signs of God's presence in them. The gifts that they received were to be freely shared with others. Let us join with Catholics throughout the world in asking the Master of the Harvest, our heavenly Father, to send more laborers into the field in the person of priests, deacons, religious, and lay ministers of all kinds. The harvest of human beings longing to belong to God is abundant!

First Reading Exodus 19:2 – 6a

Exodus chapter 19 tells the story of God forging a covenant with his people of Israel, newly freed from slavery in Egypt. Moses has led them to Mount Sinai and to the beginning of their new life as God's "kingdom of priests, God's holy nation." These are the people that Jesus in today's Gospel calls God's lost sheep, and he sends out the Twelve apostles to proclaim to them God's good news of healing and wholeness.

Second Reading Romans 5:6 - 11

The Letter to the Romans is St. Paul's greatest theological masterpiece. It is longer than any other New Testament letter and deeply reflective. Paul is writing from Corinth in the winter of the year 57/58 to the community of Christians in Rome whom Paul had never met. This letter is so important for the Christian Church today that it is the source for the Second Reading every Sunday through September 13th. The reading is not related to the Gospel or to the First Reading which are in harmony with one another. This is a unique, and stand alone reading. In the verses we hear today, Paul describes how Jesus' Death accomplished our reconciliation with God and thus our salvation. This is one of the great New Testament explanations of what is involved in divine love: a willingness to die for sinners who do not deserve such mercy and compassion.

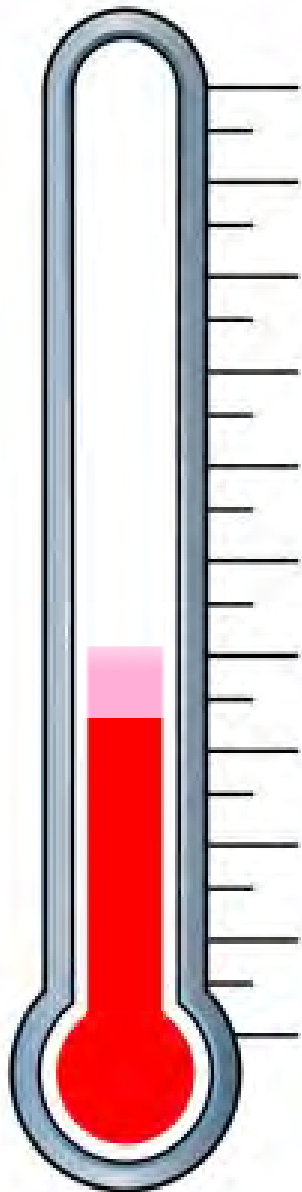
