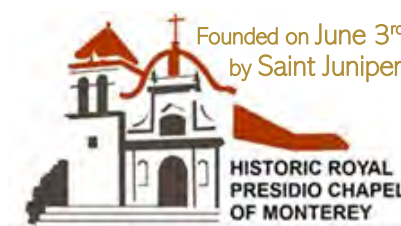

XII SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A remind us to trust in God, even when we face challenges. They show that God is with us, gives us strength, and offers us grace through Jesus.

- **Trust in God's Protection:** Jeremiah faced danger for speaking God's truth, but he trusted that God would protect him. Jesus tells His followers not to be afraid because God watches over them.
- **Courage in Faith:** Jeremiah and Jesus both talk about standing firm in faith, even when Others oppose us. God calls us to be brave and trust that He will take care of us.
- **God's Mercy and Kindness:** The psalm reminds us that God listens to those who suffer. Even in hard times, we can call on Him and trust in His love.
- **Sin and Grace:** Adam's sin brought suffering, but Jesus brings new life. Because of Jesus, we can receive grace and forgiveness.
- **Fear of God, Not People:** Jesus tells His followers not to fear those who can harm the body. Instead, they should respect and follow God, who has power over both body and soul.
- **God Knows and Cares:** Jesus reminds His followers that God knows even when a small bird falls. If God cares for the smallest creatures, He surely cares for each of us.

This Sunday's readings teach us to trust in God's care, even when we are afraid. He is with us, giving us strength and guiding us in faith.

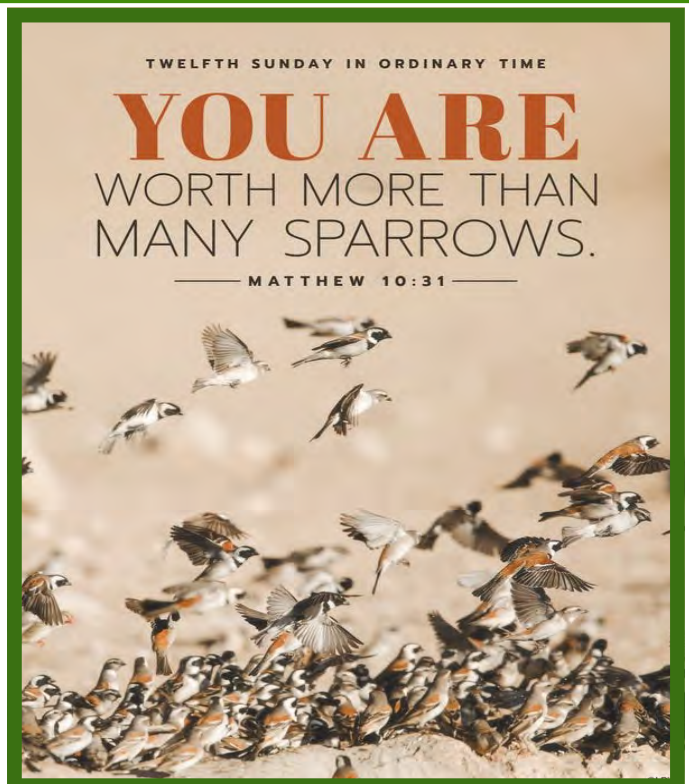

TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: DO NOT BE AFRAID

These many weeks of Ordinary Time will guide us through the Gospel of Matthew as we journey through the months of Summer and Fall to the Feast of Christ the King at the end of November. The Gospel of Matthew is the anchor for the Scripture readings which will be proclaimed to us during this time. Matthew's Gospel seems to have been written between the years 80 and 90 by a Greek-speaker who also knew Jesus' languages, Aramaic and Hebrew. He was probably a Jewish Christian and was not an eye-witness of Jesus' ministry. He uses the Gospel of Mark as well as collections of other sayings of Jesus. Chapter 10, part of which we hear today, is his description of the mission of the disciples as they are sent to proclaim the Good News that belongs to all of us who believe in Jesus Christ.

The Gospel Matthew 9:36 – 10:8

In last Sunday's Gospel, we heard Jesus call twelve of his disciples and sent them out to share his own mission of rescuing the lost sheep of Israel. Jesus warns them that this mission also involves persecution; his disciples will also share his Passion. They will be despised by fellow Jews and rejected by members of their own families. But when they are brought to trial for their faith, they should not be concerned. The Holy Spirit will inspire them to be faithful witnesses. As disciples, they (and we) are of infinite value in the eyes of our loving God. We are "worth more than many sparrows" since we are God's own dear children. Despite the coming darkness and opposition, Jesus' disciples must be fearless in proclaiming the light and the truth of the Gospel. We too must not be afraid, but trust completely in the infinite love of God which never leaves us.

First Reading Jeremiah 20:10 - 13

Jeremiah, one of the four major prophets in the Old Testament, was chosen by God when he was very young, and he served faithfully for five decades. During the last half of Jeremiah's career, the Assyrian empire collapsed and Babylon became the supreme power. This led eventually to the destruction of Jerusalem and the exile of God's People in 587 BC. Chapter 20, part of which we hear today, contains Jeremiah's confessions, his inner struggle with his vocation, and his complaints for the persecution he suffered on behalf of God. But despite his lamentation, he ends with praise: "Sing to the Lord! He has delivered the life of the needy from the hands of evildoers." You can see how this reading would be chosen as being in harmony with today's Gospel in which Jesus warns his followers that God's call often involves persecution and suffering.

Second Reading Romans 5:12 - 15

In this Second Reading which is independent of both the Gospel and First Reading, St. Paul presents teachings that will become the basis for the concept of original sin, that is, that every human being has sinned the way Adam and Eve did, so that the effect of this sin continues, especially as symbolized by the death we all experience. But the Gospel's Good News is that Adam and Eve's disobedience is not the end of the story. It is indeed identified as the "happy fault" that leads to our redemption in Christ Jesus.

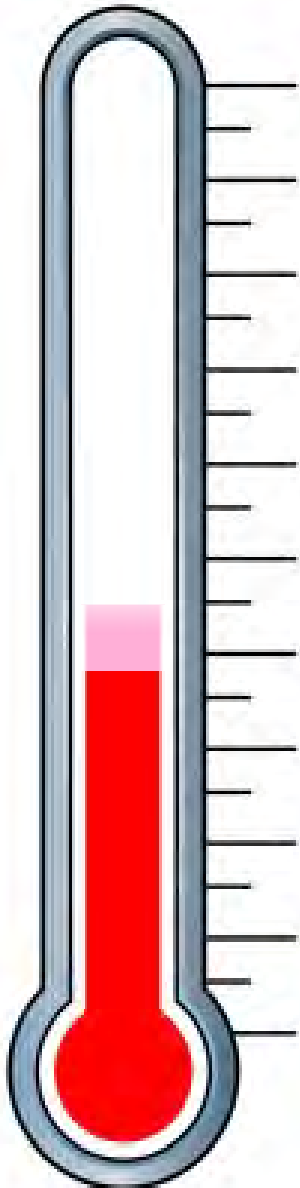

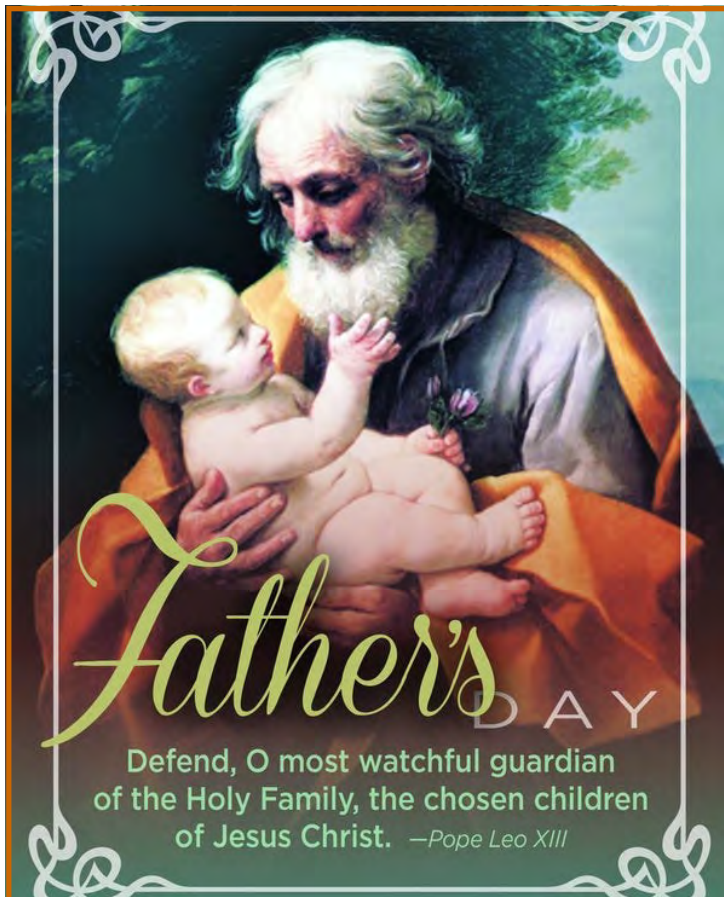
