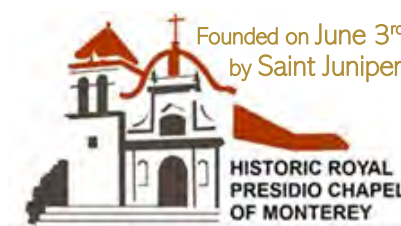

XIII SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A show the importance of faith, hospitality, and commitment to Jesus. They teach that following Christ means putting Him first and trusting in His promises.

- **Putting Jesus First:** Jesus calls His followers to love Him more than their own families. This means faith should guide all choices and actions.
- **Hospitality and Generosity:** The woman in Shunem welcomed Elisha into her home, and he promised her a son. This shows that kindness and generosity bring blessings.
- **Baptism and New Life:** Paul explains that through baptism, Christians die to sin and rise to a new life. This means they should live for God and avoid sin.
- **Sacrifice and Reward:** Jesus teaches that following Him comes with sacrifices. But even small acts of kindness in His name will not go unnoticed.
- **Trusting in God's Promises:** The woman in Shunem did not expect to have a child, but God made it happen. This shows that God fulfills promises in unexpected ways.
- **Serving Others:** Jesus says that welcoming His messengers is like welcoming Him. Helping others, even in small ways, is part of Christian life.

The 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time reminds Christians to trust in God and follow Jesus completely. It shows that faith requires both commitment and love in action.

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: *GIVE WITHOUT EXPECTATION*

The Sundays of Ordinary Time continue to be anchored in the Gospel of Matthew. We hear the most important sections of his Gospel in order. The First Reading is chosen from all the Books of the Old Testament to reflect on the message of each Sunday's Gospel. It is easy to make the connection this Sunday with the woman from Shumen who receives the Prophet Elisha and offers him generous hospitality. She does indeed receive a Prophet's reward, just as Jesus states in the Gospel. During this week, several great Feasts occur. The first is Monday, June 29th, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul; Wednesday, the Feast of St. Junípero Serra, the founder and first pastor of our Parish in 1770; Friday, July 3rd, the Feast of the Apostle Thomas; and of course July 4th, Independence Day, the 250th anniversary of the founding of our country. May Almighty God protect us and bless us!

The Gospel Matthew 10:37 - 42

As opposition to Jesus' message grew, he exhorted his disciples to have courage under persecution. Jesus knew that not everyone would accept the Gospel his followers proclaimed. Even members of their own families might be their adversaries. They must be willing to sacrifice everything for the sake of God's kingdom; they must be willing to prefer nothing to Christ. Those who choose this difficult path can be sure that they will share Jesus' own Paschal Mystery: they will die and rise with him. Like the prophets of old, they must be prepared to suffer for speaking God's Word. Jesus' disciples were Christian "prophets" who spoke God's saving message of the new and eternal Covenant. Our Baptism too impels us to live this same Christ-centered life as missionary disciples.

First Reading 2 Kings 4:8 – 11, 14 – 16a

The books of First and Second Kings span the 400-year history of Israel, from the royal dynasty of David's son Solomon to the division of the united kingdom and the destruction of the Temple in 587 BC. The books of Kings report the prophetic careers of Elijah and his disciple, Elisha, who continued the work of the great prophet by proclaiming God's faithfulness to the Covenant. Elisha's encounter with the Shunammite is the story of a prominent woman who is interested in promoting the work of God, as shown in the hospitality she provided for the prophet without expecting anything in return. In due time, though, she is rewarded for her service. She conceived and bore a son as Elisha promised.

Second Reading Romans 5:12 – 15

Today's Second Reading is also proclaimed on that most holy night of the Easter Vigil. After hearing seven powerful readings from the Old Testament, the Gloria is sung and the holy space is flooded with light. Immediately after the opening Collect, this New Testament Reading is proclaimed with great faith and joy. Those listening most attentively to this reading are the catechumens, knowing that within moments they too will die and rise with Christ in their Baptism. In the early Church, Christian converts often came from pagan roots. They had to make a decision that meant leaving their former lives behind and being born again. When they are immersed in the baptismal font, the water closes over them, and it was like being buried, like dying in those holy waters, letting all their sins drown. When they then emerged from the water, it was like rising from the grave. They are immersed in both Christ's Death and his Resurrection. May today's reading remind us that this same experience is ours, not only at our Baptism, but every day, every breath.

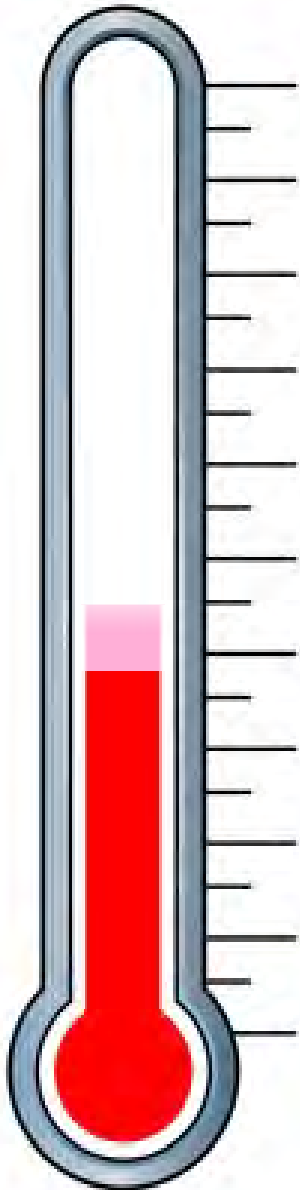

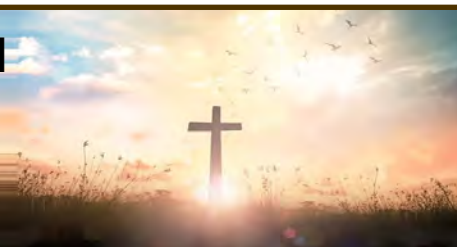
