Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion (Year A) *by young-catholics.com*

Palm Sunday Year A remembers Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and the events leading to his death. The readings show his humility, suffering, and obedience to God.

- **Jesus as King:** The people welcomed Jesus as a king, but he came in humility, riding a donkey. This shows that his kingship is different from earthly rulers.
- **Obedience to God:** Jesus followed God's will, even when it led to suffering and death. His obedience shows trust in God's plan.
- **Betrayal and Denial:** Judas betrayed Jesus, and Peter denied knowing him. These show human weakness and the need for mercy.
- **Suffering and Sacrifice:** Jesus endured pain, humiliation, and death on the cross. His suffering was an act of love for others.
- **God's Victory:** Jesus' death was not the end. God raised him up, showing that good is stronger than evil.
- **Jesus as Servant:** He did not seek power or glory. He humbled himself and served others, even in suffering.

Palm Sunday calls people to follow Jesus' example of humility, obedience, and love. It reminds them that suffering is not the end, but God brings hope and new life.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION (YEAR A): This Is My Blood of the Covenant

Every Palm Sunday, the Church provides us one of three texts which help us enter into the Passion and Death of Jesus. Since this is Year A, it is the Passion of St. Matthew which will guide our prayer and reflection during these last days of Lent. Next year, we will hear the Passion according to Mark, and then in 2028, we will hear the Passion according to St. Luke. And every Good Friday offers us the Passion according to St. John. Each of these scripture texts provides us with powerful and unique ways to encounter Jesus' last supper with his disciples, the betrayal by Judas, the denial by Peter, as well as many insights into Jesus' own experience as he is condemned and on trial, crucified, and abandoned. Matthew's Gospel offers us a precious opportunity to accompany Jesus on the way to Calvary, to remain with him on the cross, and to experience his burial. As you listen to this very lengthy and moving reading, you may be struck by different images or notice different phrases. Is there someone in the story that you especially identify with? Are there some words of Jesus that you find particularly touching? Let us continue to pray for each other as we enter into these last days of Lent, preparing our hearts for the Great Three Days of the Easter Triduum.

The Gospel Matthew 26:14 – 27:66 Each Gospel of Jesus' Passion is a balance between historical recollection and theological reflection. Although the key historical events are generally the same in each Gospel, the evangelist's purpose in revealing the true identity of Jesus Christ is unique. Matthew's Passion is quite different from Luke's, and Mark's Passion is tremendously different than John's. As we listen to this Gospel, we find that Matthew often shows us how these events are the fulfillment of events in the Old Testament and thus part of God's overall plan for the salvation of the world. Matthew also characterizes Jesus as the innocent one with references to the Passover lamb as well as the Suffering Servant. Matthew often uses the most unlikely witnesses to testify to Jesus' innocence, two of whom as Judas and Pilate's wife. Matthew also has the most vivid and extensive descriptions of the cosmic events unleashed by Jesus' death. May our participation in this Passion reading today be but one of many times this week we accompany Jesus in our prayer and reflection, profoundly grateful for his ultimate, selfless, saving sacrifice.

The First Reading Isaiah 50:4 - 7 This reading is one of the four "Suffering Servant Songs" of the Prophet Isaiah. It poignantly foreshadows the suffering of Jesus as he approaches Calvary, giving his back to those who beat him, not shielding his face from buffets and spitting, yet confident that the Lord God will be his help. It is so easy for us to see in this poem the very story of the Lord's Passion. God does in fact come to the aid of his obedient Servant, who is his Beloved Son, and does not let him end in disgrace.

The Second Reading Philippians 2:6 - 11 This reading is an early Christian hymn that concisely summarizes the mystery at the heart of our Christian faith: though divine, Jesus willingly embraced our human likeness and was obedient to God, even to death. And because of this, he was exalted by God, and all creation acknowledges him as Lord.

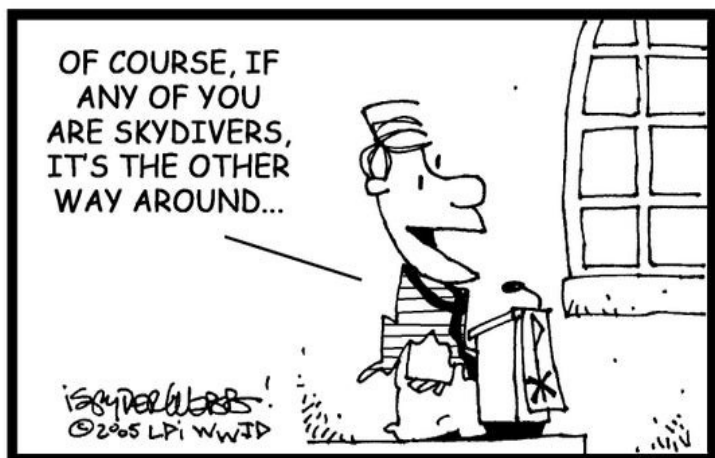
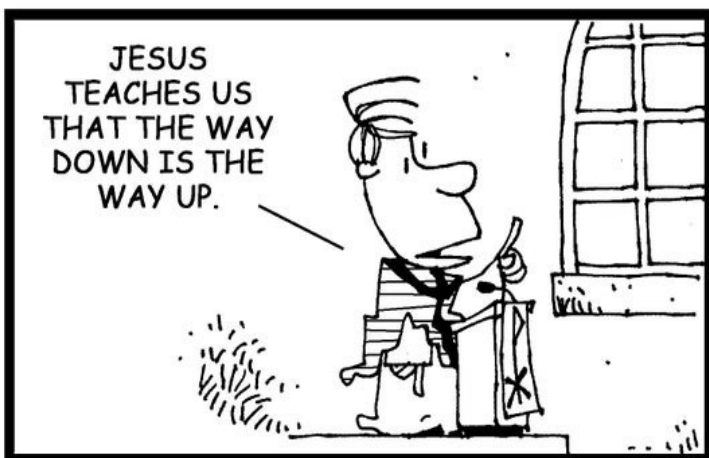


SABIAS QUÉ..?

2026 LENTEN FAST & ABSTINENCE

ASH WEDNESDAY and **GOOD FRIDAY** are obligatory days of FASTING and ABSTINENCE for Catholics. In addition, **FRIDAYS DURING LENT** are obligatory days of ABSTINENCE.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on **FASTING** are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning **ABSTINENCE** from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA CUARESMAL 2026

El **MIÉRCOLES DE CENIZA** y el **VIERNES SANTO** son días obligatorios de AYUNO y ABSTINENCIA para los católicos. Además, los **VIERNES DE CUARESMA** son días obligatorios de **ABSTINENCIA**.

Para los miembros de la Iglesia de rito latino, las normas de **AYUNO** son obligatorias desde la edad de 18 años hasta los 59. Cuando se ayuna, es permitido comer una comida completa, así como dos comidas más pequeñas que juntas no equivalgan a una comida completa.

Las normas sobre la **ABSTINENCIA** de carne aplican a los miembros de la iglesia católica de rito latino desde los 14 años en adelante.

Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia Pascual (la noche del Sábado Santo) como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús y prepararnos para compartir más plenamente y celebrar más apropiadamente su Resurrección.
