SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER *by young-catholics.com*

The 6th Sunday of Easter Year A focuses on faith, love, and the Holy Spirit. The readings show how God strengthens His people and stays with them always.

- **Preaching and conversion:** Philip shares the message of Jesus in Samaria, and many people believe. The Gospel reminds us that love for Jesus leads to action and obedience.
- **The gift of the Holy Spirit:** Peter and John pray for the new believers, and they receive the Holy Spirit. Jesus promises the Holy Spirit to those who love Him.
- **Faith in suffering:** Peter encourages Christians to stay strong when facing hardship. Jesus suffered for others, and His followers are called to remain faithful.
- **Obedience to Christ:** Jesus says that loving Him means keeping His commandments. Faith is not just words but actions that show love and commitment.
- **God's constant presence:** Jesus promises that He will not leave His followers alone. The Holy Spirit is given to guide and help them.
- **Love and relationship with God:** Jesus says that those who love Him will be loved by the Father. This shows that faith is not just belief but a close relationship with God.

The readings for the 6th Sunday of Easter remind us that God is always with His people. Faith, love, and the Holy Spirit guide Christians in their daily lives.

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR A): God's Presence

These last two weeks of the Great 50 Days, the Great Easter Season, serve as pivot points in the focus of this sacred liturgical season. We turn from the earlier focusing on the disciples' life-changing encounters with the Risen Jesus now to preparing for his Ascension and Jesus' sending of the Holy Spirit upon his disciples. Jesus promises he will never abandon his disciples, will never leave them orphans. He says the same to each of us now. He promises us the gift of the Spirit of truth who is the Advocate, or as Fr. Patrick likes to say, our divine "defense attorney," who guards and protects us, always leading us gently, day by day, more deeply into the heart of God the Father.

The Gospel John 14:15 – 21 In his farewell discourse to his disciples, Jesus tells us his final wish for us: that we should be faithful to his commandments, since this obedience is the proof of our love for him. Another theme is that of mutual presence, mutual immanence: "the Father in me and I in the Father; I in you and you in me." This favorite theme of John's Gospel sheds a great deal of light on the deep meaning of the Church's life and the life of the individual baptized member. We learn from Jesus that it is the Spirit who will sustain the Church. It is the Spirit who will make more fully known the mysteries of Christ, the meaning of his life and words and actions. The Spirit also gives Christians the strength to live in a world that does not understand them or see what they see. Jesus speaks in this discourse of the Holy Spirit as "Another Advocate." Who is the first Advocate? Throughout his earthly life, Jesus had been at his disciples' side. Now the Spirit will take Jesus' place and continue his work. We pray: Come, Holy Spirit!

The First Reading Acts of the Apostles 8:5 – 8, 14 - 17 This reading begins with a focus on miraculous deeds wrought by Philip, one of the deacons we heard about last Sunday. Much to everyone's surprise, the persecution of the Christian community and its eviction from Jerusalem did not interfere with the ministry of the Church at all. In fact, the eviction from Jerusalem was a catalyst that propelled the Gospel outward to even more people. Through the power of the Spirit, Philip was able to convince multitudes of Samaritans to believe in Jesus. The second part of the reading describes how Peter and John completed the Samaritans' Christian initiation by the gift of the Holy Spirit through the laying on of hands and prayer.

The Second Reading 1 Peter 3:15 – 18 In today's reading, we hear how, in a hard and hostile world, Christians must witness to their faith in the Crucified and Risen through patience endurance. In the flesh, Jesus was put to death, thus sharing the common lot of all humanity, but the Spirit has given him a new kind of life. That is the basis for our hope that we too will be transformed and glorified. For people with such a hope, difficulties and persecutions hold no terrors, for they are the way by which we attain a share in Jesus' victory.

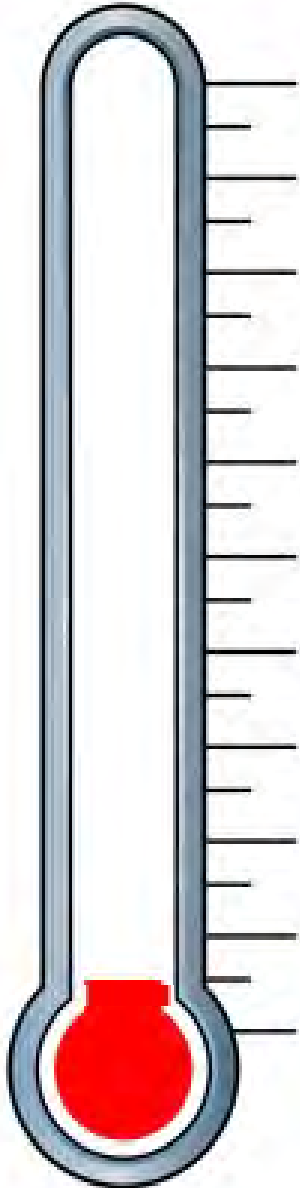
