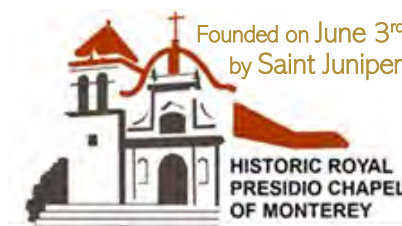

The Ascension of the Lord Year A celebrates Jesus returning to heaven and His ongoing mission through His followers. The readings show His promise to be with us always and the call to share His message with the world.

- **Jesus' mission continues:** Before ascending, Jesus tells His disciples to spread His teachings to all people. This reminds believers that His work did not end but continues through them.
- **The promise of the Holy Spirit:** Jesus assures His followers that they will receive the Holy Spirit. This gives them strength and guidance to carry out His mission.
- **Jesus' authority over all:** The Gospel shows Jesus as the risen Lord with authority over heaven and earth. This gives confidence that His power is greater than anything in the world.
- **The call to evangelize:** Jesus commands His disciples to teach and baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This call extends to all believers, urging them to share the faith.
- **Faith in God's plan:** The disciples watch Jesus ascend and are reminded to trust in God's plan. Even when they do not understand, they are called to believe and follow.
- **Jesus remains with us:** Though Jesus ascends, He promises to be with His followers always. This reminds believers that He is still present in their lives.

The Ascension of the Lord Year A is a time to reflect on Jesus' call to share His message. It reminds believers that His mission continues and that He is always with them.

THE FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD (YEAR A): I Am With You Always

Whatever happened to Ascension Thursday? Why do we now celebrate the great Feast of the Ascension of the Lord on the Seventh Sunday of Easter? One tradition of the precise chronology of the time between Jesus' Resurrection and his Ascension follows St. Luke's writings in his second volume, the Acts of the Apostles. This is the only place in the entire New Testament that speaks of a forty-day period between the Resurrection and the Ascension. That would make the day of the week a Thursday. And for long centuries in some parts of the Catholic Church a Thursday was when this Mass of the Ascension was celebrated. In the latter part of the last century, however, many parishes around the world realized that this important Feast was much neglected because most parishioners were unable to gather for Mass due to work commitments. Bishops in every country began to ask for permission to move the Feast to a Sunday when parishioners could gather. Today there are only 6 Dioceses in the United States that still celebrate the Feast of the Ascension on a Thursday (e.g., Boston, New York, Philadelphia, etc.). But all the others, including the Diocese of Monterey, have moved to celebrate the Feast on this Sunday.

The Gospel Matthew 28:16 - 20

In Matthew's Gospel, the Ascension takes place in Galilee, not in Jerusalem, and it takes place shortly after the Resurrection, not 40 days. Matthew presents the Ascension as the foundational moment for the birth of the Church. Only in this Gospel does Jesus expressly command his disciples to baptize as Jesus prepares to leave them. They are to "go, therefore, and make disciples." They are to baptize all nations and teach them to obey all that Jesus has commanded. Even as Jesus disappears physically from their eyes, he promises to be with them (and with us) always.

The First Reading Acts of the Apostles 1:1 - 11

The Acts of the Apostles opens with the announcement that this book is intended to be a sequel to the earlier book which is the Gospel of Luke. While the Gospel proclaimed Jesus' own life and ministry, Acts describes the mission Jesus gave to his disciples: to be his witnesses and to take on the work of building up the Kingdom of God in the world. Jesus reminds them that the Holy Spirit is the power they will need to be his witnesses, not only to the Jews but witnesses to the Gentiles as well in all the nations of the earth.

The Second Reading Ephesians 1:17 - 23

This reading is a prayer of thanksgiving and intercession, written in the late first century for the Churches in Asia Minor. The first half of the reading asks God to give the early disciples a spirit of wisdom and revelation that helps them know God. It then goes on to ask that they follow Christ's call. The author reminds us that God has made Jesus Christ the head of all creation and the source of growth for the Church which is the living Body of Christ. We pray along with this reading: "may the eyes of [our] hearts be enlightened" that we may know the hope that belongs to Jesus' call. We hold onto this hope.
