- **Gift of the Holy Spirit:** The Spirit comes to the disciples, giving them strength and wisdom. This gift helps them spread the message of Jesus.
- **Unity in the Spirit:** People from different places understand the disciples in their own languages. The Spirit brings people together, overcoming barriers.
- **New Life in Christ:** The Spirit brings life, just as in Ezekiel's vision of dry bones. Through the Spirit, believers are made new and filled with hope.
- **Power of God's Presence:** The readings describe God's presence in fire, wind, and mighty works. The Spirit shows God's power working in the world.
- **Mission of the Church:** Jesus sends His followers to share His message and offer forgiveness. The Spirit gives them courage and guidance to continue His work.
- **Thirst for the Spirit:** Jesus offers living water, which means the Spirit. Those who seek Him will be filled and renewed.

THE FEAST OF PENTECOST (YEAR A): RE-CREATED BY THE SPIRIT

The great rejoicing of the 50 days of the Easter Season comes to a powerful conclusion today, marking the events of the giving of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' disciples and his sending them to continue his mission into the future. The word "Pentecost" is a Greek word meaning "50," reminding us that each day between Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday has been celebrated as a Sunday, filled with "alleluias", hymns of resounding praise to the God who raised Jesus from the dead, while the community joyously used these days to baptize, to confirm, and to offer First Communion to its neophytes and children. Next week the Church Year returns to Ordinary Time (Week 8), to the predominance of green vestments and banners, and to the months ahead which offer us time and space to reflect on how the Risen Christ and the Holy Spirit are at work in our community and in our own personal lives. It was Pope Francis' insight which prompted him to name this Monday as the feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church – such an appropriate model for all of us baptized as we pray to live out the commission that Jesus has given us.

The Gospel John 20:19 - 23 Resurrection, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, plus mission: St. Luke spreads these events across fifty days in his second volume, the Acts of the Apostles. St. John's Gospel, however, concentrates all these elements into the one day of Easter. Scripture scholars encourage us not to get caught in historical questions of these details: what exactly happened? when? where? Instead we hear from both books of Scripture the truth that soon after the Death and Resurrection of Jesus, God, beginning in Jerusalem, presented Jesus fully alive to a frightened group of disciples and filled them with the Holy Spirit that they might continue Jesus' mission. Jesus' first words to his frightened and guilt-ridden disciples is "Peace be with you." Before they have a chance to ask his forgiveness for abandoning him, he blesses them with his peace and sends them to be light for the world, to heal, to be good shepherds, to forgive and reconcile, to be his presence in the world. God's gift of the Holy Spirit makes this possible, and so the Church is born.

The First Reading Acts of the Apostles 2:1 - 11 St. Luke narrates the Pentecost events in words and images that evoke the revelation at Mount Sinai. The sounds from heaven, the filling of the whole house (like the shaking of the whole mountain in Exodus 19:18), and the fire recall God's appearance at Sinai. The tongues of fire symbolize the reality that the powerful presence of God (like fire) will find expression in human words, the prophetic ministry of the disciples. The list of nations from which the Jewish pilgrims and converts come alerts us to Jesus's words at the Last Supper: what is being born is the "new and eternal covenant" which is not only for Jews but also for all peoples at the "ends of the earth" and "those far off." Every human being is invited into this new Israel, the Body of Christ.

The Second Reading 1 Corinthians 12:3b – 7, 12 - 13 In this reading, St. Paul recognizes that these manifestations of the Spirit are gifts, not skills earned by members of the community. The purpose of the gifts is always to build up the community as a whole. Paul explains that the Christian community is in a very real way the Body of Christ into which its members are born by Baptism and empowered by the Holy Spirit. The Church is blessed with diversity in its members and blessed with a unity that comes from Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

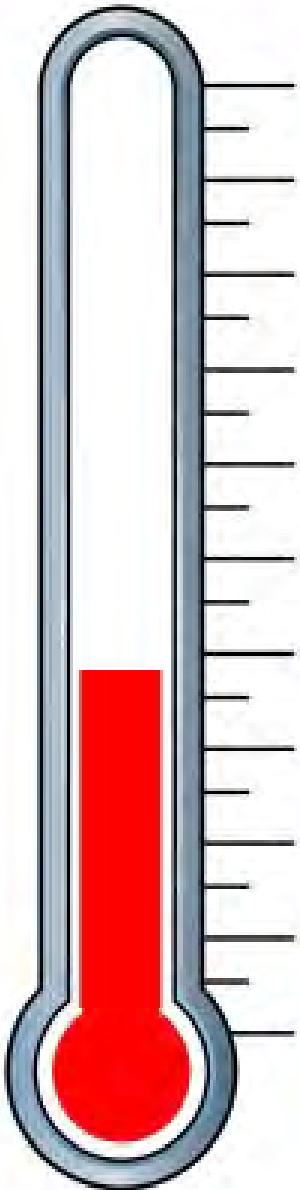

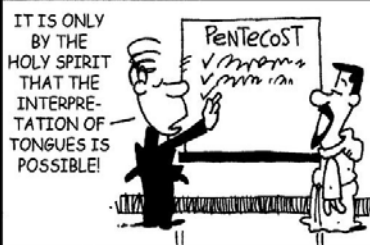

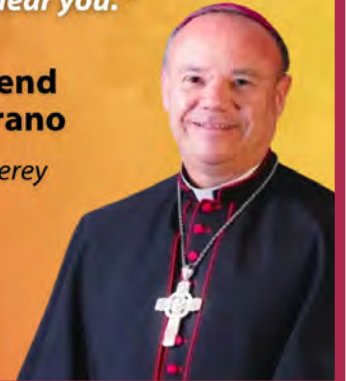
