FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER *by young-catholics.com*

The 5th Sunday of Easter Year A focuses on faith, service, and the role of Jesus in our lives. The readings show how the early Church grew, how believers are called to be living stones, and how Jesus is the way to the Father.

- **Faith in Jesus:** Jesus tells His disciples to trust in Him. He shows them that He is the way to God, and faith in Him leads to eternal life.
- **Serving Others:** The first reading shows the apostles choosing helpers to care for those in need. The Church must serve others and make sure no one is forgotten.
- **Jesus as the Cornerstone:** The second reading calls Jesus the cornerstone of God's house. Those who follow Him become part of this spiritual building.
- **God's Chosen People:** Believers are called a holy people in the second reading. They are chosen to share God's light with the world.
- **Following the Way:** Jesus says He is the way, the truth, and the life. He leads people to the Father, and no one can go to God except through Him.
- **Works of Faith:** Jesus says His followers will do great works in His name. Faith leads to action, and believers must continue His mission on earth.

Jesus calls His followers to trust in Him, serve others, and live as God's chosen people. The Church must continue His mission with faith and love.

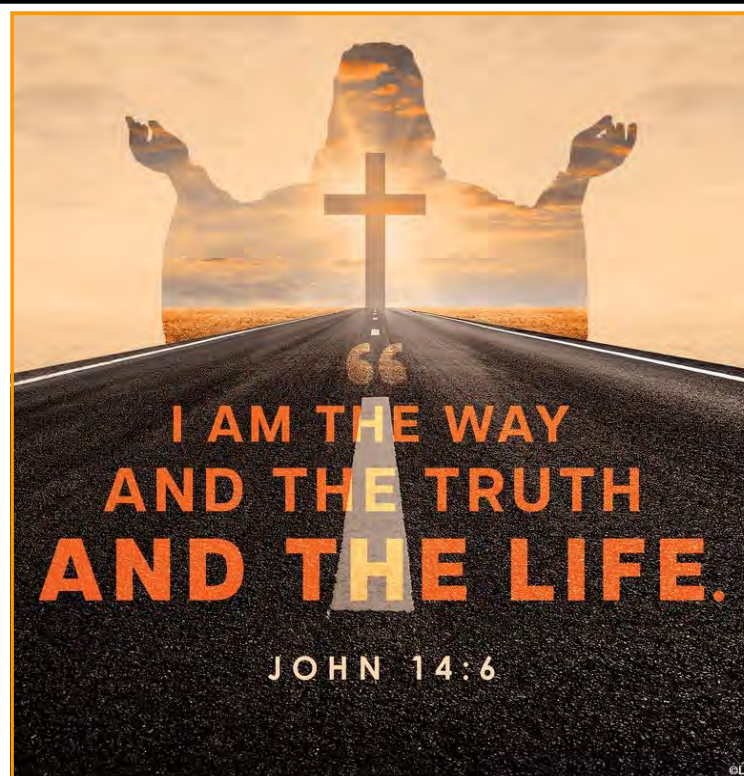

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR A): Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life

The Great 50 Days of the Easter Season continue to immerse us in readings from the Gospel of St. John. After the Second Vatican Council's mandate in 1963 that Catholics be offered a great deal more Scripture at Mass, the decision was made to expand the readings from a one year cycle (that simply repeated the same few readings year after year) to a three year cycle which would include far more of the great treasures from the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) and include readings from the Old Testament for the first time. The cycles are simply referred to as Year A (Matthew), Year B (Mark), and Year C (Luke). You may wonder – what happened to John's Gospel? As you can see from the wonderful readings of the Easter Season, many of the Gospel readings come from John as is true this Sunday.

The Gospel John 14:1 - 12

Last Sunday we heard Jesus refer to himself as the Good Shepherd who has given up his life for his sheep. We who belong to Christ hear his voice and follow him as he cares for us and as he brings other sheep into his one fold. In today's Gospel, Jesus reveals to us that he IS the Way, the Truth, and the Life. When Philip asks Jesus to show them the Father, Jesus promises them (and us) that whoever has seen him has seen the Father. As Fr. Patrick is fond of reminding us as he points to our magnificent crucifix, here before our eyes is the love of the Father; here is the Father present and active and in our lives. Whoever has seen Jesus Crucified and Risen has seen the Father. Jesus dying on the cross for us is the perfect and complete incarnation of God the Father. Our God is not a harsh and demanding judge far off from us, ready to condemn our every sin. Jesus teaches us that the Father is only compassionate love, permanently present to us, never abandoning us. In response to this gift of divine love, we commit ourselves to live in the world as missionary disciples, being the hands, heart, and mind of Christ, loving one another as he has loved us.

The First Reading Acts of the Apostles 6:1 - 7

In this reading, we see the early Christian community challenged by the presence of two language groups: Jewish Christians who speak Aramaic and Greek-speaking Christians whose needs were being ignored. The Holy Spirit raises up seven new leaders to serve this minority community, one of whom becomes the first Christian martyr.

The Second Reading 1 Peter 2:4 - 9

The First Letter of Peter is addressed to Gentile Christians living in an environment hostile to their way of life. Like Jesus who was rejected, so they are also suffering for living as his disciples. But they are to take courage. They are not called and saved as individuals but as a people. They are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own." As Jesus is the living stone, so we his disciples join him in forming the "spiritual house" where God dwells in the midst of the human family.

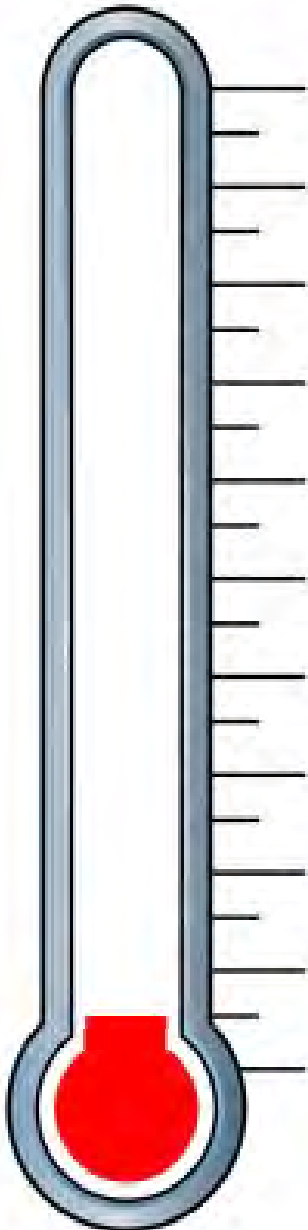

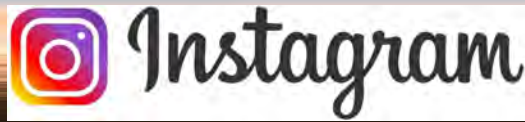

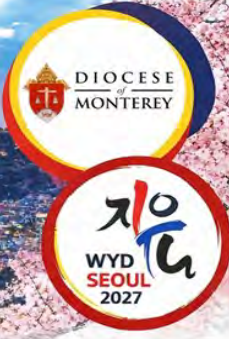
