THE MOST HOLY TRINITY (YEAR A): God So Loved the World

Last Sunday, the great Feast of Pentecost, was the Spirit-filled conclusion to the Great 50 Days of the Easter Season. The long weeks of Ordinary Time then began last Monday, leading us from the 8th week in Ordinary Time to the 34th Week, just before Advent, 2026. The name given to this extended period of the Church Year can be quite misleading. There is absolutely nothing “ordinary” about this time for us who have been baptized into Jesus’ Death and Resurrection. In fact, every moment and every breath bring us into closer relationship with the Crucified and Risen Christ: nothing ordinary about that! The name for these weeks comes from the word “ordinal” – that is, these weeks are the weeks that are numbered: the 9th week, the 18th week, the 31st week, etc. Beginning our entrance into Ordinary Time are two feasts which are more about ideas than about events in the life of Christ. The first is this Sunday: the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity.

The Gospel John 3:16 - 18

These three verses could be used to summarize the entire Gospel message. Verse 16 first reminds us of God’s love not just for one people or nation but for the whole world. The words “gave his only Son” recall Abraham’s willingness to sacrifice his son and God’s intervention to save Isaac. Verse 17 is the great good news that gives hope to the world: that God did not send Jesus to condemn us but to save us – despite our sins and failures and doubts and brokenness. The divine Persons of the Holy Trinity have only one purpose in mind: the salvation of every human being throughout history. What the Father, Son, and Spirit ask of us as faithful disciples is belief in Jesus as Lord. Let us ask the Trinity today to increase our faith!

The First Reading Exodus 34:4b – 6, 8 - 9

In this reading, Moses experiences the presence of God for a second time on Mount Sinai. Listen to the words that God himself uses to reveal who he is to his people (and to us): “The Lord [is] a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.” This is the God whom we gather to encounter and to worship.

The Second Reading 2 Corinthians 13:11 - 13

In this reading, St. Paul reminds us that our relationships with one another in the community of disciples are to be characterized by joy, by loving concern for others, and by uprightness, unity, and peace. Since these are the very characteristics of God, we who are made in God’s own image and likeness are to act in just the same way.

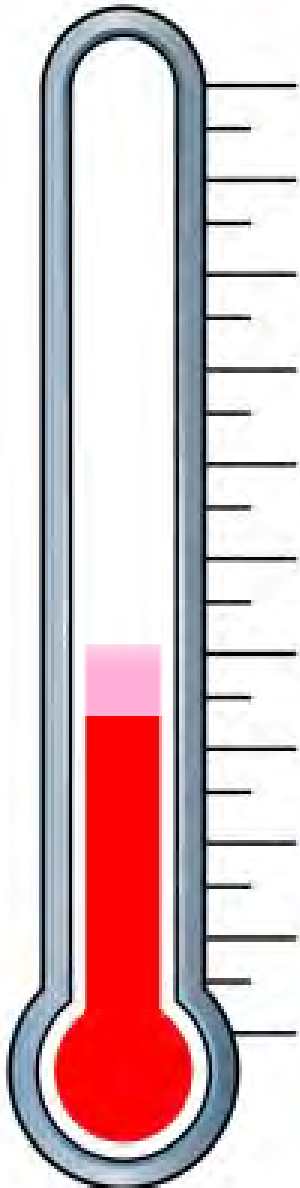

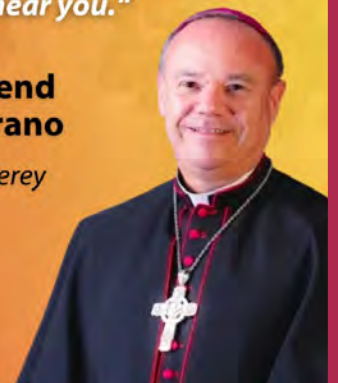

Consecrating the United States to the Sacred Heart

On November 11, the bishops of the United States voted to consecrate this nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The consecration will take place in 2026 to celebrate America's *semiquincentennial*, that is, the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. What does this mean? Why consecrate the nation to the Sacred Heart?

Devotion to the Sacred Heart has developed over the centuries following the experiences of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the apparitions she witnessed in the seventeenth century. Popes have lauded the practice of consecration of the self, home, and even whole nations to the Sacred Heart. In his encyclical instituting the Solemnity of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI, drawing on the teaching of Pope Leo XIII, commended the "pious custom" of consecrating the nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a way to recognize the kingship of Christ. By celebrating this important national anniversary with this devotion, we have the opportunity to encourage all Catholics to honor our Lord and to "infuse the spirit of the Gospel into various communities and departments of life."

In *Dilexi Te*, Pope Leo invited us to contemplate Christ's love, which moves us out on our mission to attend to our sisters and brothers suffering in the world today, particularly in our care for poor and vulnerable people. As we reflect with gratitude on the blessings God has bestowed on our country, our devotion to the Sacred Heart demands that we consider how we might foster truth, justice, and charity in American life. We are called to bring our faith into the actions we take and the lives we lead in our communities. We celebrate the ways the Church has contributed to a more just world, and we invite all in our society to see the face of Christ reflected in each sister and brother. We welcome God's "kingdom of justice, fraternity and solidarity," remembering that "God has a special place in his heart for those who are discriminated against and oppressed, and he asks us, his Church, to make a decisive and radical choice in favor of the weakest." This anniversary and consecration will be a great opportunity to promote the beautiful devotion to the Sacred Heart and to encourage the laity to offer their lives in service to God and their country.
