

### The Conmemoration of All The Faithful Departed by young-catholics.com

The Catholic Church teaches that Purgatory is a place where souls are purified before entering Heaven. Some souls are not ready to enter Heaven right after death. We pray that God will help them on their journey to Heaven. Our prayers can help them. This is why All Souls' Day is important.

On All Souls' Day, Catholics often go to Mass and pray for the dead. Many visit cemeteries to pray for their loved ones who have died. The Church encourages us to pray for <u>all</u> the souls in Purgatory, not just our own family or friends. All Souls' Day is different from All Saints' Day, which is the day before. All Saints' Day honors all the saints in Heaven. All Souls' Day focuses on helping those still waiting to enter Heaven. Both days remind us of the hope we have in eternal life.

The practice of praying for the dead goes back to the early Church. Christians have always believed that prayers could help those who have died. Even in the early centuries, people would pray for the souls of loved ones, especially during the Mass. This belief grew stronger over time. In the 10<sup>th</sup> century, a monk named St. Odilo of Cluny helped to officially start All Souls' Day. St. Odilo was the leader of a monastery in France. He wanted to set aside a special day to pray for all the souls in Purgatory. In the year 998, he declared that November 2 would be All Souls' Day.

This practice spread to other parts of the Church. Soon, All Souls' Day became a part of Catholic life across Europe. Different countries had their own customs for honoring the dead. Many people would go to Mass, pray, and visit cemeteries to remember their loved ones. Over time, these customs became a tradition that we still follow today. In the Middle Ages, the Church strongly encouraged prayers for the dead. People were reminded that their prayers could help the souls in Purgatory. The idea of offering Masses and prayers for the dead became very important. This was a key part of All Souls' Day. Over the centuries, the Church continued to teach about the importance of praying for the dead. All Souls' Day became a fixed part of the Church calendar. Today, Catholics around the world celebrate it in much the same way, with Masses and prayers for the souls in Purgatory.



### THE CONMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (YEAR C) by Sr. Sharon McMillan, SNDdeN

When we recite the Apostles' Creed, we include the words "the communion of saints." This Sunday is a perfect time to recall the communion of saints to which we belong. While yesterday's Solemnity of All Saints often highlights those saints who are officially recognized by the entire Roman Catholic Church, today's celebration reaches out to embrace all the faithful departed of every time and place. The idea of remembering all the faithful departed seems to have arisen from the ordinary Christian customs surrounding the death and burial of loved ones in one's family. It was St. Isidore of Seville (who died in 636) who seems to have been the first to celebrate All Souls' Day every year and to include all those who had died. This custom spread rapidly throughout northern Europe, and was finally accepted in Rome in the 1200s. There is a wide variety of readings that may be chosen for this day; the readings we are using are the one Fr. Ommar has chosen for us to reflect on. All the prayers of today remind us of the profound truth of the life we share with the Risen Christ. The beautiful words of the entrance antiphon remind us: "Just as Jesus died and has risen again, so through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep; and as in Adam all die, so also in Christ will all be brought to life."

The Gospel John 6:37 - 40 After Jesus has fed the 5000 people from 5 barley loaves and two fish, all the people are satisfied and acclaim him "the prophet who is to come into the world." He has sent his disciples ahead of him to Capernaum and the next day finds that the same crowd who wanted to make him king has followed him there. Jesus explains to them the meaning of the bread that they shared from his hands. He is the true bread of life. He continues to open their eyes about the meaning of the will of the Father and the fullness of life that God desires for each of them and each of us. Jesus promises that all who believe in him will share in eternal life. Jesus raises up all the faithful departed on the last day. The life he offers to them and to us is life in abundance, life filled with God's blessings of joy and peace, the life that God wishes for all of us: life that lasts forever.

**The First Reading** Wisdom 3:1 - 9 This inspirational First Reading will be familiar to those who participate in Catholic funerals. It is often the first choice of the family members for the funeral Mass because of its message reminding us that "the souls of the just are in the hands of God." The Book of Wisdom appeared between 100 BC and AD 100 among Greekspeaking Jews in Egypt. Rather than simply collecting wise sayings, Wisdom encouraged its readers to reflect upon Israel's wisdom tradition, especially when faced with suffering, especially the suffering of death. This reading affirms the reality of eternal life, especially for those who lives have been in harmony with the goodness that God wishes for all of us.

The Second Reading Romans 6:3 – 9 Sections from this powerful reading of St. Paul's letter to the Romans is heard every Easter Vigil, just before the proclamation of the resurrection Gospel. The context on that holy night of course is the initiation of the catechumens into new life in Christ through the waters of Baptism, the sacred anointing with chrism of Confirmation, and the reception of Christ's own Body and Blood in Holy Communion. How very striking are the opening words: "Are you not aware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" The waters of Baptism into which we are immersed allow us to die with Christ; all our sins die in that water. We then rise reborn as new creatures, filled with the divine life of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This is the divine life that embraces all the faithful departed now and forever.





DID YOU KNOW THAT ..? The word **VOCATION** comes from the Latin word vocare. which means "to call." By faith, we understand that God calls every person to a special and unique way of life. Which one is your calling?



CATECHETICAL Topic: SAN CARLOS BORROMEO & 'NVAW' by SC Liturgy Team

Dear San Carlos Parishioners.

This year, National Vocation Awareness Week is celebrated from Sun., Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>, to Sat., Nov. 8<sup>th</sup>. This special week offers us an opportunity to prayerfully reflect on God's call in our own lives and to promote and pray for vocations among our families and community to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life.

The week holds special significance because it contains the feast day of St. Charles Borromeo, which is observed on Tue., Nov. 4th. St. Charles (a.k.a. San Carlos), our patron, is also known as the patron saint of seminarians, making his feast day a fitting anchor for National Vocation Awareness Week.

WHO WAS ST. CHARLES BORROMEO?: (Reformer) Living during the 16th century Counter-Reformation, St. Charles was a prominent cardinal and the Archbishop of Milan. He worked tirelessly to implement the reforms of the Council of Trent, which addressed the need for better-educated and more dedicated clergy. (Founder of Seminaries) Seeing the need for proper formation, St. Charles founded the first seminaries to provide a dedicated space for the education and spiritual development of future priests. His model of priestly formation is still the basis for seminary training today. (Shepherd of the People) During a devastating plague in Milan, St. Charles demonstrated immense pastoral care by staying with his people, ministering to the sick, and using his own resources to help the suffering. His courageous example serves as an inspiration for all clergy. St. Charles Borromeo reminds us that nurturing vocations is not a new task for the Church. His example challenges all of us to support those discerning God's call.

Trabajó incansablemente para implementar las reformas del Concilio de Trento, que abordaron la necesidad de un clero mejor educado y más dedicado. (Fundador de Seminarios) Al ver la necesidad de una formación adecuada, San Carlos fundó los primeros seminarios para proporcionar un espacio dedicado a la educación y el desarrollo espiritual de los futuros sacerdotes. Su modelo de formación sacerdotal sigue siendo la base de la formación en el seminario hoy en día. (Pastor del Pueblo) Durante una plaga devastadora en Milán, San Carlos demostró un inmenso cuidado pastoral al quedarse con su gente, atendiendo a los enfermos y utilizando sus propios recursos para ayudar a los que sufren. Su valiente ejemplo sirve de inspiración para todo el clero. San Carlos Borromeo nos recuerda que nutrir las vocaciones no es una tarea nueva para la Iglesia. Su ejemplo nos desafía a todos a apoyar a quienes disciernen el llamado de Dios.
