The Solemnity of Christ the King Year C reminds us that Jesus is our true King. His kingdom is different from earthly kingdoms because it is built on love, mercy, and sacrifice.

- **Jesus as King**: Jesus is not a king who rules with power and force. He leads with love, humility, and service.
- God's Kingdom is Eternal: Earthly rulers come and go, but Jesus' kingdom will never end. His rule is one of peace and justice.
- Salvation Through Jesus: The second reading reminds us that Jesus rescues us from sin. He brings us into his kingdom and makes us part of his family.
- Mercy and Forgiveness: Jesus forgives the criminal on the cross. His kingdom is open to all who turn to him with faith.
- **Humility and Suffering**: Jesus does not save himself from the cross. His suffering shows that true kingship is about sacrifice, not power.
- Faith in Jesus: The good thief believed in Jesus even when others mocked him. His faith brought him the promise of eternal life.

The Solemnity of Christ the King Year C reminds us that Jesus is a different kind of king. He rules with love, mercy, and justice, and his kingdom will never end.

THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR C) by Sr. Sharon McMillan, SNDdeN

The Church Year 2025 draws to a close with this great Feast, encouraging us to gather all our gratitude to God for the blessings of this year into our celebration of this Mass. This Church Year has guided us through the 34 weeks of Ordinary Time as well as the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany as well as the Great 90 Days of the Easter Triduum (the center and heart of the Church Year), the Easter Season itself, and its preparation of the holy Season of Lent. St. Luke's Gospel has accompanied us throughout this year. With the First Sunday of Advent, the Gospel proclaimed almost every Sunday will be the Gospel of St. Matthew. Before his death, Pope Francis urged us to see ourselves this year as Pilgrims of Hope in days that are too often filled with division, dehumanization, wars, famine, and every kind of act of hate that humans can invent, failing to realize that we are truly sisters and brothers. Let us continue to pray for one another and for our brothers and sisters throughout the world as this Year of Hope ends and the new Church Year begins with the sacred Season of Advent.

The Gospel Luke 23:35 – 43 "Gospel" means "good news," the news of our salvation. Today's Gospel makes this point for us when it offers us the words to Jesus of the good thief, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus lovingly replies, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise." here is the proclamation of salvation through the cross and a promise made by a crucified King. This King is the conqueror of death; of this, Jesus' answer leaves no doubt. His words are not a vague promise but the statement of one who is truly in command. The good thief drew from Jesus an answer that will give hope to all generations until the end of time: the hope that death is the door to paradise and that "to be with Christ" is indeed the goal to which all Christian life is leading and the reality that lies beyond death.

The First Reading Ezekiel 34:11 – 12, 15 - 17 God has continually sought out his people throughout history, inviting them into a covenant relationship. But the "shepherds of Israel" have let God's sheep scatter over the face of the earth, feeding themselves rather than their people. So God pledged to tend his flock himself, and has cared for us faithfully as the one true Shepherd.

The Second Reading 1 Corinthians 15:20 – 26, 28 St. Paull tells us in his letter to the Christians in Corinth about Christ the shepherd, who is God made flesh. Although death and sorrow have been on the rampage, the resurrection of Jesus Christ has overturned the reign of evil, sweeping away even the destructive powers of death. Through his dying and rising, Jesus has opened the way to life for every human heart.

CATECHETICAL Topic: Solemnity of Christ the King by SC Liturgy Team

Dear San Carlos Parishioners.

On this final Sunday of the Liturgical Year, we joyfully celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, a feast that proclaims the eternal kingship of Jesus over all creation, over every heart, nation, and power.

The Solemnity was established by Pope Pius XI in his 1925 encyclical Quas Primas, in response to the growing secularism, nationalism, and atheism that followed the horrors of the First World War. The Holy Father saw that many had rejected God's holy law in both private and public life, bringing discord, hatred, and ruin to society. He therefore instituted this feast to solemnly proclaim that Christ is truly King, both in His divine and human nature, and that his Kingdom must reign over every human reality.

In the words of Pius XI: "When once men recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessing of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony."

Originally celebrated on the last Sunday of October (to crown the liturgical year and prepare for All Saints). Pope Paul VI, with the changes in the liturgical calendar in 1969, transferred the Solemnity to the very last Sunday of the Liturgical Year and enrich its title to "King of the Universe."

This new placement is profoundly meaningful. By concluding the liturgical year, the feast directs our gaze to the eschatological fulfillment of history: the glorious return of Christ the King, when every knee will bend before him and his kingdom of truth, justice, love, and peace will be fully revealed. It is the triumphant culmination of all the mysteries we have celebrated throughout the year, and a powerful preparation for Advent, as we awaits His coming.

Today, as so many earthly ideologies and powers demand our ultimate allegiance, this Solemnity calls us to enthrone Christ as King in our hearts, families, workplaces, and society. Only when he reigns will we find true peace.

Queridos feligreses de San Carlos:

En este último domingo del Año Litúrgico, celebramos con alegría la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo, fiesta que proclama el eterno reinado de Jesús sobre toda la creación, sobre cada corazón, nación y poder.

Esta solemnidad fue instituida por el Papa Pío XI en su encíclica Quas Primas de 1925, en respuesta al creciente secularismo, nacionalismo y ateísmo que siguieron a los horrores de la Primera Guerra Mundial. El Santo Padre vio que muchos habían rechazado la santa ley de Dios tanto en la vida privada como en la pública, sembrando discordia. odio y ruina en la sociedad. Por ello, instituyó esta fiesta para proclamar solemnemente que Cristo es Rey verdadero, tanto en su naturaleza divina como humana, y que su Reino debe reinar sobre toda la realidad humana.

El Papa Pío XI dijo: "Cuando los hombres reconozcan, tanto en la vida privada como en la pública, que Cristo es Rey, la sociedad recibirá por fin la gran bendición de la verdadera libertad, la disciplina bien ordenada, la paz y la armonía".

Originalmente celebrada el último domingo de octubre (para culminar el año litúrgico y preparar la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos), el Papa Pablo VI, con los cambios en el calendario litúrgico de 1969, trasladó la Solemnidad al último domingo del año litúrgico y enriqueció su título a "Rey del Universo".

Este nuevo ajuste tiene un profundo significado. Al concluir el año litúrgico, la fiesta dirige nuestra mirada a la plenitud escatológica de la historia: el glorioso regreso de Cristo Rey, cuando toda rodilla se doblará ante él y su reino de verdad, justicia, amor y paz se revelará plenamente. Es la culminación triunfal de todos los misterios que hemos celebrado durante el año y una poderosa preparación para el Adviento, cuando esperamos su nueva venida.

Hoy, cuando tantas ideologías y poderes terrenales exigen nuestra lealtad absoluta, esta Solemnidad nos llama a entronizar a Cristo como Rey en nuestros corazones, familias, lugares de trabajo y sociedad. Solo cuando él reine encontraremos la verdadera paz.
