The First Sunday of Advent (Year A) by young-catholics.com

The 1st Sunday of Advent in Year A starts a new season of hope and preparation. Advent is a time for watching, waiting, and preparing for Christ. The readings call us to stay alert, live with purpose, and seek peace.

- Staying Awake for Christ: Advent reminds us to stay watchful and ready. Jesus urges us to be aware and prepared, not caught off guard by his coming.
- **Hope and Anticipation:** Advent brings a season of hope for what is to come. This hope pushes us to prepare our hearts and lives for the coming of Christ.
- Living in the Light: Paul's letter encourages us to live in the light and leave behind actions that keep us in darkness. Advent is a time to step forward with kindness, honesty, and peace.
- **Embracing Peace:** Isaiah's vision of nations gathering in peace shows God's hope for a world united. We are reminded to be peacemakers, especially as we prepare for Christ's coming.
- **Turning from Distractions:** The Gospel warns of the dangers of letting daily life distract us from Christ's arrival. Advent is a call to put aside what pulls us from God and make room for Him.
- **Beginning Again with Faith:** Advent opens a new church year and invites us to refresh our faith. We are called to enter the season with hearts open to grow closer to God.

The 1st Sunday of Advent invites us to slow down and focus on God. As Advent begins, we are called to prepare, stay alert, and live with hope.

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

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (YEAR A) by Sr. Sharon McMillan, SNDdeN

Happy New Year! The new Church Year of 2025/2026 begins this Sunday, the first Sunday in the holy Season of Advent. These four weeks invite us to draw closer to Christ and closer to one another with a renewed focus on the three comings of Christ. Three comings? What are those? The Church asks us first to watch and pray for the future coming of Jesus, our Lord and Savior who is coming again on the last day. Isaiah the Prophet, St. Paul, and Jesus himself speak to us today: "Stay awake! Awake from your sleep! Walk in the light of the Lord! The day of the Lord is near!" Advent also invites us to experience with deep longing the coming of Jesus today: in our lives, in the lives of family and friends, in the realities of the whole world today with all their joys and sorrows, fear, anxiety, and certain hope. Jesus is coming to each and to all of us today, now, at every breath. Let us wake up and go to meet him. Lastly, the Season of Advent encourages us to reflect on Jesus' coming in the womb of Mary: his coming "yesterday" in the incarnation leading to his saving Death and Resurrection. Advent then directs us to experience his coming yesterday, today, and tomorrow. Advent is a period for devout and joyful expectation. Although the color is violet and the singing of the Gloria is absent, this time is not a kind of "short Lent." This is not a penitential season but one that draws our hearts and minds into longing for Christ our Lord, into a sharper awareness of who we truly are as his disciples, as people of hope. The Church sings: "O come, O come, Emmanuel! Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel!" His coming is certain. Let him find us watchful in prayer, ready to welcome him.

The First Reading Isaiah 2:1 - 5 During the Advent Season, as distinct from the Sundays in Ordinary Time, all three readings are bound together in a type of "general harmony." All three readings are chosen to speak to us as a community and as individuals of Christ's future coming. Today we are introduced to one of three great figures who accompany us throughout this holy Season: Isaiah the Prophet. His clear, strong voice announces God's vision for the future of his beloved people who are returning from exile. The day of the Lord is surely coming, and that day will be a time of true justice for all people who make up the human family. We will not fight against each other ever again; the enemy to be destroyed is war, not other human beings. The light of the Lord will guide us to his holy mountain, to his saving light, to the peace and justice he desires for all people.

The Second Reading Romans 13:11 - 14 St. Paul writes with urgency that God's vision is at hand. "Our salvation is nearer now that when we first believed." As disciples of Jesus Christ who long for his return in glory, we should act as sisters and brothers to one another. Our waiting for him is not passive. It invites us to live what we believe, to awake from sleep, and to "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" as a garment of light that embraces us, warms us, and accompanies us into lives of authentic conversion.

The Gospel Matthew 24:37 - 44 The Church designates this year as Year A, the first of 3 year-long cycles of 3 readings every Sunday. The anchor for this Year is the Gospel of Matthew. We begin today with a passage from the end of his Gospel, chapter 24. Jesus has come to Jerusalem for the last time. He is speaking only to his disciples, the last time he will speak to them before his Passion. He urges them (and us) to stay awake, to be prepared for his return. He warns us with the example of the people who lived during the days of Noah. They completely ignored the calls to conversion of mind and heart, and so were caught off guard when in fact the flood came. Jesus promises us that he is coming, but at a time we do not expect. So we are to be vigilant, hopeful and not fearful, watchful in prayer, longing for that day when God's vision for the whole human race will be fulfilled. Come, Lord Jesus!






