TWENTY SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME by young-catholics.com

The 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C offers us various lessons through its readings. Each reading provides insights into how we live and believe as Christians.

- Living by Faith: The prophet Habakkuk questions God about the suffering he sees. God responds by telling him to wait for a vision that promises justice. This teaches us that faith involves trusting God's timing and plan, even when we don't understand.
- **Gift of the Spirit:** In the second reading, Paul encourages Timothy to use the gifts God has given him. This reminds us that God equips us with spiritual gifts, and we should use them boldly and lovingly.
- Power of Small Faith: Jesus mentions that faith as small as a mustard seed can do great things. It shows us that the size of our faith is less important than its true presence and action in our lives.
- **Duty and Service:** The Gospel also compares faith to a servant doing his duty. It teaches us that following Jesus means serving without expecting rewards; our actions are part of our Christian duty.
- **Vision and Persistence:** Habakkuk is told to write down a vision clearly. This tells us that having a clear vision and persistence in faith can guide us through challenges and uncertainties.
- **Courage in Witnessing:** Paul's words to Timothy highlight the need for courage in proclaiming our faith. This encourages us to be strong and persistent in sharing our belief with others.

These themes from the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time encourage us to reflect on our faith and duties as Christians. They guide us in living out our beliefs in practical and faithful ways.



TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR C) by Sr. Sharon McMillan, SNDdeN

From the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time, when the apostles plead with Jesus to "increase our faith," to the 34th and last Sunday in Ordinary Time (called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe) when the criminal asks Jesus to remember him in death, the readings highlight how our faith is lived out. Throughout these 8 Sundays at the very end of the Church Year, we hear over and over that the Lord is faithful; he is faithful even when we are unfaithful. Also throughout these last weeks of the 2025 Church Year, we see the pattern of readings that the biblical scholars created for the new Missal after the Second Vatican Council (1970). The Gospels follow a three-year cycle: Year A (Matthew), Year B (Mark), and Year C (Luke). The 34 weeks of Year C, for example, began with Chapter 4 of Luke's Gospel and presented in order the most significant readings from that Gospel. (What happens to all the other passages? They are included as the Gospels for the readings at weekday Mass.) The First Reading then, as you will have noticed, is taken from a wide variety of Old Testament books. There seems to be no pattern at all – just readings that jump around from all over the Old Testament. But there is a pattern. Biblical scholars chose Old Testament readings that would be fulfilled in the Gospel for the Sunday. Most Sundays the harmony between the two readings is strikingly clear; this Sunday not so much! The Second Reading during Ordinary Time is completely independent of the Gospel and 1st Reading. Scholars decided to offer Catholics the most important sections of the Letters of St. Paul (and other writers). You may find wonderful connections between the Second Reading, the Gospel and First Reading – but the Church did not choose the 2nd Reading for that connection. The Advent and Christmas Seasons begin soon; the arrangement of the readings for those liturgical seasons (also Lent and Easter) follow a completely different pattern which we will explore when Advent begins.

The Gospel — Luke 17:5 - 10 Today's Gospel seems to contain two unconnected themes: an answer to a plea and a parable. If we look closely, however, there is indeed a connection between the two. The answer to a plea of the apostles has to do with faith and all that faith can accomplish when it is strong. The parable shows this same effectiveness as flowing from a gift of God. The apostles receive faith as a gift; the effectiveness of this faith is not rooted in them and their merits, but, like faith itself, is a precious gift given to them by God. Jesus does not answer the apostles by saying that he will give them what they ask; instead, he shows them what they could do if they did have a stronger faith. The parable that Jesus uses at this point is a simple one: servants have no right to recognition because of what they do, since they belong to the Master. The apostles are servants, and if they accomplish great things, it is only because the Lord gives them the power to do so; he is not obliged to be grateful to them, because if they accomplish anything, it is by his power.

The First Reading — Habbakkuk 1:2 – 3, 2:2 - 4 The Prophet Habakkuk cries out to God in the midst of the desperate circumstances of his day. He doubts whether God is truly in charge when all around him is destruction and violence. Over and over (6 times!) in this reading, God promises that the vision will be fulfilled, but it will take faith.

The Second Reading 2 Timothy 1:6 – 8, 13 - 14 Today's reading is a very beautiful passage from a letter the Apostle Paul wrote to a disciple on whom he himself had laid ordaining hands. The gift of God that Timothy received must constantly be revived, for it is meant to be an active gift that will serve the entire Church. Timothy must not be timid or ashamed about bearing witness to the Lord, but accept the suffering involved in preaching the Gospel.




