TWENTY FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME by young-catholics.com

The 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time calls us to reflect on our use of worldly resources and our responsibilities to others. The readings challenge us to live with honesty, justice, and faithfulness to God above all else.

- **Justice for the poor:** The first reading reminds us that God cares about the poor and condemns cheating and exploitation. We are called to treat others with fairness and care for those in need.
- **Honesty in daily life:** The Gospel warns against dishonesty and urges us to act with integrity. God sees how we handle small things, and our choices reveal our loyalty to Him.
- **Prioritizing God over wealth:** Jesus teaches that we cannot serve both God and money. We must decide where our true allegiance lies and choose what leads to eternal life.
- **Prayer for all people:** The second reading encourages us to pray for everyone, including leaders and those in authority. This reminds us that peace and order come from God's guidance and our prayers.
- **Responsible use of resources:** The Gospel challenges us to use our talents and possessions wisely for God's kingdom. Earthly goods are tools for doing good and helping others.
- Faithful service to God: Jesus calls us to be faithful in our responsibilities. By serving God with sincerity, we show our love and trust in Him.

The 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time helps us reflect on our values and choices. It challenges us to live with faith, integrity, and care for others in all that we do.



TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR C) by Sr. Sharon McMillan, SNDdeN

As we gather together to pray this Sunday, it is hard to realize that we are fast approaching the end of this Church Year. The Thirty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time is the great Feast of Christ the King and is the last Sunday before Advent and the beginning of the 2026 Church Year. Only 8 weeks to go! Two more Feast Days will interrupt the pattern of this Year during which we have been following the Gospel of Luke in order. First, there is November 2, the Commemoration of All Souls (el Día de los Muertos) which is followed by November 9, the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (a feast that celebrates the unity of the Church under the leadership of the Pope whose cathedral church is the Lateran Basilica, not St. Peter's). But before the end of the Church Year, we hear several of the most beloved passages from Luke's Gospel: the parable of the rich man and Lazarus; the story of Jesus curing the 10 lepers of whom only one returns to thank him; and the parable of the persistent widow. Let us take these last few weeks of Year C and savor the inspiration for our life in Christ that comes from St. Luke.

The Gospel Luke 16:1 - 13 This parable of the dishonest steward appears only in Luke's Gospel. That the steward is clever to the point of being crafty makes the fact that Jesus commends him difficult for us to appreciate. Stewards made a living by collecting rents and debts for their masters and charging the debtors interest on the amount owed which would then to go into the steward's own coffers. Here the steward is shameless in the lengths he will go to maintain his position. He is not trying to hide anything from the rich man, his employer. Indeed, he may even want the rich man to find out about his altering the books. His hope is that his cleverness may win back his employer's favor, but barring that outcome, he will at least have made some grateful clients take him in. The steward's prudent and energetic initiative in achieving his ends calls attention to Jesus' lesson. Jesus names the problem in verse 9. The term "dishonest wealth" reflects the danger rooted in worldly goods. Jesus warns the listener to use the wealth, but not to place any trust in it. Only trusting in God will lead to an eternal dwelling; everything else is counterfeit. Verse 13 is a saying that also appears in Matthew's Gospel. "Mammon" means more than wealth and riches. It can signify anything of this world that one relies on: titles, positions, privileges, and honors. Mammon is anything which takes our attention away from God, the true source of life. This string of sayings gives a new application to the parable: disciples of Jesus are to show as much intelligence in the use of wealth as the unjust steward did in his own interests. Jesus insists that money as well as our good health, intelligence, education, skills of all sorts – in fact, anything given to us by God – all these are to be put at the service of discipleship, at the service of the poor. They are ultimately for love – love of God, neighbor, and self.


The First Reading Amos 8:4 - 7 Today's First Reading, chosen by biblical scholars to be a provocative reflection on the Gospel, challenges the people of the Prophet Amos' time to examine their own business practices in light of God's preferential option for the poor. Amos puts words to the secret thoughts of the greedy who scheme to cheat even on holy days and who scheme to force the lowly into slavery. Those who "trample the needy," even to the point of tempering with the scales, risk God's judgment.

The Second Reading 1 Timothy 2:1 – 8 Much of First Timothy consists of a Church order, setting out the duties of the Church's ministry and (so here) describing the liturgical activities of the Christian assembly. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are urged to pray for everyone so that all may be saved. The Christian community is meant to be a community of prayer, but not one that only looks inward. We are to be intent on the salvation of the whole human family, those who know Christ, those who do not believe in God, those who may seem to be our enemies. Since Jesus "wills that everyone be saved and to come to knowledge to the truth," our prayers always include the common good and salvation for all our sisters and brothers, whether they know they are that or not.


