XIV SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A show God's kindness and mercy. They remind us that Jesus brings peace and calls us to trust in him.

- **Humility of Christ:** Jesus comes as a humble king, not with power and force, but with gentleness. He invites people to follow him, not through strength, but through trust and love.
- **God Gives Peace:** The readings speak of a king who brings peace to all people. Jesus offers rest to those who are tired and struggling.
- **Trust in God:** Jesus says that God reveals truth to those who are humble and open. This shows that faith is not about knowing everything, but about trusting God.
- **Life Through the Spirit:** Those who follow the Spirit will have real life. The readings remind us to leave behind sin and live in God's way.
- **God Helps the Weak:** The psalm tells us that God lifts up those who fall. Jesus also calls those who are burdened to come to him for rest.
- **Jesus' Gentle Way:** Jesus does not make life harder for people. He offers a way that brings peace and rest to the soul.

The Sunday, teaches about Jesus' kindness and the peace he brings. It reminds us to trust him, follow his way, and find rest in him.

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

JESUS REVEALS THE MYSTERIES OF GOD'S KINGDOM

As you have noticed, the Sundays in Ordinary Time do not have their own character as the Sundays of Advent or the Sundays of the Easter Season do. They take their direction and perspective on the person of Jesus from the Gospel that is proclaimed almost every Sunday in Ordinary Time. In this Year A, that is the Gospel of Matthew. This is the lengthiest of the three synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke). He understands Jesus as Emmanuel, God-with-us, the one who comes to save, the incarnate Wisdom of God. For Matthew, Jesus is the great and humble Teacher who forms his disciples in the way of following him. Jesus is also the new Moses who fulfills the prophecies of the Old Testament.

The Gospel Matthew 11:25 - 30

In today's Gospel, Jesus reveals that his message is for the little ones of the earth. This is good news! Following the example of Jesus himself, the Church reaches out to embrace the poor and lowly of the world. This means that "no one is without a family in this world: the Church is a home and family for everyone, especially for those who 'labor and are heavy laden'" (St. Pope John Paul II). Jesus' hands and voice and wisdom in this world are ours; we are the missionary disciples whom he sends into the world to make this divine vision a reality: in Monterey, on the Peninsula, wherever we are. The last few verses are unique to Matthew's Gospel. The invitation to come to know Jesus, the Wisdom of God, is universal, offered to all who are willing to learn from him and follow through on the demands of discipleship. Jesus, the Wisdom of God, offers all, not just Jews, a yoke that is free, liberating, easy, restful and ultimately life-giving. Today's Gospel offers us a truly life-transforming invitation from Jesus: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened." Let us answer that invitation whole-heartedly throughout the coming week.

First Reading Zechariah 9:9 - 10

In the last few centuries before Jesus was born, the Jewish people were longing for a triumphant Messiah king who would physically overturn their oppression by the Romans. The Prophet Zechariah did speak of a Messiah, but one who would come in lowliness and peace, not in a reign of military power and might with war horses and chariots. We hear the fulfillment of this reading in today's Gospel in the words of Jesus, our Messiah, who is meek and humble of heart, and who offers to share his form of life with us.

Second Reading Romans 8:9, 11 - 13

We continue to hear significant sections from St. Paul's letter to the people of Rome during these weeks. Today's passage emphasizes the role of the Holy Spirit in binding us to Christ and to the community in a human life that even death cannot conquer. The Spirit whom we received in Baptism and whose life we nourish through the Eucharist will raise our bodies on the last day; this is also the Spirit who enlivens us for holiness every day.

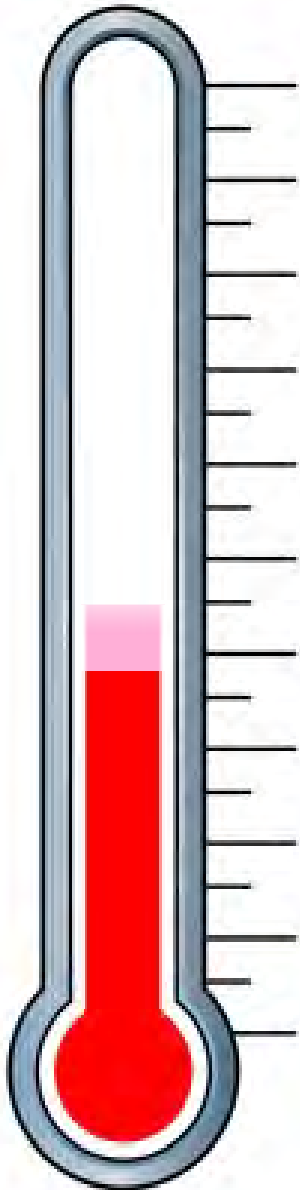

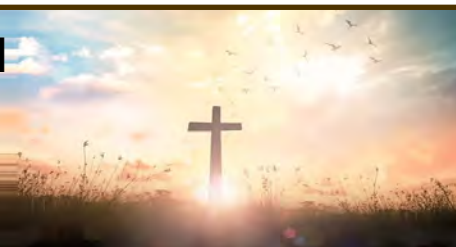

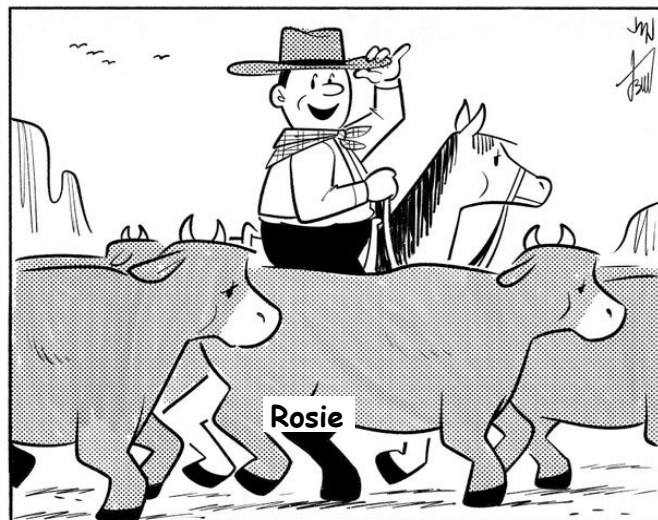
