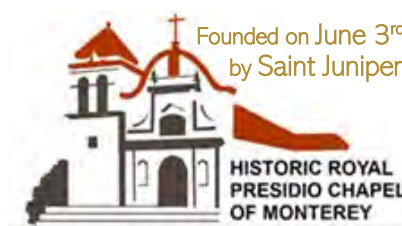

XIX SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A show how God works in quiet ways and in moments of struggle. They remind people to trust in God, even when things seem hard or uncertain.

- **God's Quiet Presence:** God was not in the strong wind, earthquake, or fire, but in a gentle whisper. This shows that God often speaks in quiet ways, not through loud or dramatic signs.
- **Trust in God:** Peter walked on water when he trusted Jesus, but he sank when he doubted. Faith means keeping our eyes on God, even when we are afraid.
- **God's Strength in Weakness:** Elijah felt tired and afraid, but God still guided him. When people feel weak, God gives them what they need.
- **Jesus Saves:** Peter cried out when he was sinking, and Jesus reached out to help him. God does not leave people alone in their struggles.
- **Faith Over Fear:** The disciples were afraid of the storm, but Jesus calmed the wind and waves. Trusting God brings peace even in difficult times.
- **Love for Others:** Paul loved his people so much that he would give up everything for them to believe in Christ. True love wants others to know God.

The 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A teaches about faith, trust, and listening to God. These lessons help people grow closer to God in daily life.

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: TAKE COURAGE, IT IS !!

During this coming week, the 19th week in Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates some important feast days. Monday, August 10th is the feast of St. Lawrence (+258), Deacon and Martyr of the city of Rome. After Saints Peter and Paul, St. Lawrence is also a patron of the city of Rome. This Tuesday is the Feast of St. Clare of Assisi (+1253), who was a disciple of St. Francis; she also founded the Order of Poor Clare Sisters. This Friday is the feast of St. Maximilian Kolbe (+1941), a Conventual Franciscan who was killed at Auschwitz when he volunteered to take the place of the father of a family. Saturday is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Since the Solemnity falls on a Saturday, it is not a holyday of obligation this year. The Mass for the Solemnity at San Carlos Cathedral is at 11:00am. Our Blessed Mother, under this title, is the patroness of France, Paraguay, Jamaica, South Africa, and New Caledonia. Mary, assumed into heaven, pray for us!

The Gospel Matthew 14:22 - 33

Today's Gospel offers us a glimpse of Jesus' identity as truly the Son of God. The disciples, exhausted from battling a storm on the Sea of Galilee, are terrified to see what they believe is a ghost appearing before them. But it is truly Jesus who identifies himself with the name of God from the Old Testament: "I AM." The end of this "walking on the water" scene is remarkable in Matthew's Gospel. Instead of the disciples failing to understand Jesus' identity (as in the Gospel of Mark), here they worship Jesus as "Son of God." Even more significant is the scene that Matthew adds where Jesus invites Peter to come to him on the water, and as Peter begins to sink, Jesus immediately stretches out his hand to catch him. This is the first of three instances of special material about Peter that Matthew includes in his Gospel. Peter's impetuosity, the inadequacy of his faith, and Jesus' individual care to lead Peter farther are quite characteristic of Matthew's Gospel. As a man of little faith who would sink unless the Lord saved him, Peter is representative of the other disciples; their faith and his in the Son of Man gains strength from Jesus' powerful, helping hand. This is the same loving hand that is always held out to rescue us too.

First Reading 1 Kings 19:9a, 11 – 13a

The Prophet Elijah is fleeing for his life when he arrives at Mount Horeb. At the mouth of the cave, God wants to show him that his fears are unfounded and that God has abandoned neither prophet nor the nation. God reveals his presence to Elijah, not in spectacular and dramatic cosmic events, but in a tiny whispering sound. In today's Gospel, Jesus reveals his divine presence through the deep peace after the calming of the raging sea.

Second Reading Romans 9:1 - 5

This reading is a continuation of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans which we have been hearing during these recent Sundays in Ordinary Time. Paul writes of the deep anguish he feels that many of his Jewish brothers and sisters do not believe that Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah; he is the fulfillment of all that was promised to them throughout their history. But their rejection of Jesus makes it possible for the early Church to welcome all other peoples into the Body of Christ.
