XVII SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A show God's care for people. They remind us that God provides, loves, and invites all to come to Him.

- **God's Generosity:** God gives freely to all. Isaiah speaks of food and drink without cost, and Jesus feeds thousands with little.
- **God's Love is Unbreakable:** Paul says nothing can separate us from God's love. No hardship or struggle can take it away.
- **Trust in God's Care:** The disciples worried about feeding the crowd, but Jesus provided. This shows that God knows our needs and cares for us.
- **Invitation to Come to God:** Isaiah calls all to come and receive. Jesus welcomes the crowd and gives them what they need.
- **Jesus Feeds the Hungry:** The feeding of the five thousand shows Jesus' care for people's needs. He does not send them away but provides for them.
- **God's Promise is Eternal:** Isaiah reminds us of God's lasting covenant. God's love and care never end.

The Eucharist as Spiritual Food: Jesus' miracle of feeding the crowd points to the Eucharist. Just as He gave them bread to satisfy their hunger, He gives us Himself in the Eucharist to nourish our souls. God provides for both physical and spiritual needs. The 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A reminds us to trust in Him.

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Sundays of Ordinary Time continue to offer us the key passages of St. Matthew's Gospel in order. We are at the half way mark in Ordinary Time which consists of 34 Sundays, taking us all the way to Advent when the 2027 Church Year begins. During this coming week, the Church celebrates some important feast days. August 4th honors St. John Vianney (+1859), universally known as the "Curé of Ars," and as patron saint of priests, especially diocesan clergy. August 6th is the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, and August 6th (and August 9th) are the anniversaries of the atomic explosions over Hiroshima and Nagasaki, reminding us to pray intensely for world peace. August 6th is also the anniversary of the death of St. Pope Paul VI (+1978) who provided exceptional leadership during the Second Vatican Council (1962 – 65). And finally August 8th is the feast of St. Dominic (+1221), founder of the great Dominican Order of priests, sisters and brothers.

The Gospel Matthew 14:13 - 21—The multiplication of the loaves and fishes is a significant miracle that appears in all 4 Gospels. The event stresses God's gracious love incarnate in Jesus his Son, reaching out to heal and nourish God's people. Here we also see Jesus teaching his disciples the meaning of true pastoral ministry. They want to dismiss the tired and hungry people, but Jesus "moved with pity" insists that the disciples feed the people themselves, even with just five loaves and 2 fish. Echoing the same pattern of actions that we will see at the Last Supper, Jesus takes the bread and fish, blesses them, breaks them, and gives them to the disciples to share with the people. Then all the people, in their many thousands, are more than satisfied, even leaving a huge amount of left-overs. Such an abundance is a clear experience of God's lavish love, and a sure sign that in Jesus, in long-awaited Messiah has arrived. His teaching and his miracles reveal to us that God cares profoundly for all people, and nourishes us in all our needs.

First Reading Isaiah 55:1 - 3—As the Babylonian exile draws to a close, the Prophet Isaiah invites the people to turn once again to God, who ultimately satisfies all our needs. God invites all to focus on what truly nourishes, as opposed to spending money on what does not satisfy. Isaiah wants people to know that ultimate nourishment comes from God's desire to "renew with them the everlasting covenant." God's covenant love is better than any riches we can imagine.

Second Reading Romans 8:35, 37 - 39—This reading, which is independent from the Gospel and from the First Reading (which are in harmony with one another), offers for our reflection passages expressing St. Paul's most powerful theology. For Paul, God's ultimate manifestation of covenant love and fidelity established with all creation is fully revealed in Christ Jesus. In Jesus' suffering, Death, and Resurrection, God has united himself with us so completely that nothing can ever separate us from his love. Paul teaches that the hardships we experience are not God's punishment for our sinfulness. Rather, in Jesus, our suffering links with his suffering and brings us into closer relationship with our life-giving God. In Jesus, we become so united with God that neither hardships nor any earthly power can ever separate us "from the love of God in Christ Jesus." What a hopeful teaching for us to always remember!

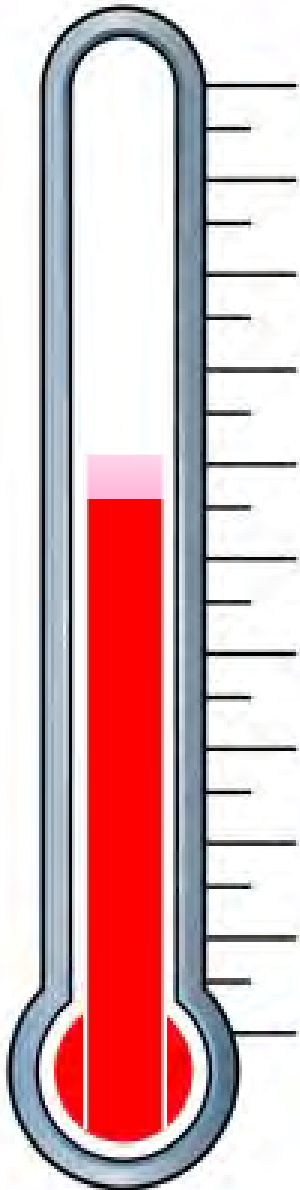

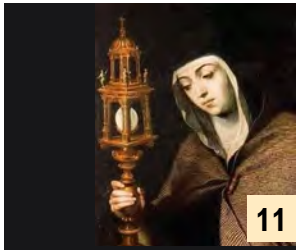

Saint Dominic de Guzmán was a Castilian priest and founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), a 13th-century mendicant order devoted to poverty, study, and preaching to combat heresy, especially in southern France. Known for his gentleness and zeal, he established communities near major universities to unite contemplation with evangelization, and promoted the Rosary tradition. He left a legacy of scholarship and missionary work before his death in Bologna, Kingdom of Italy, in 1221. The **Basilica of San Domenico** is one of the major churches in Bologna and where the remains of Saint Dominic are buried. The Church celebrates his Feast Day on August 8th.

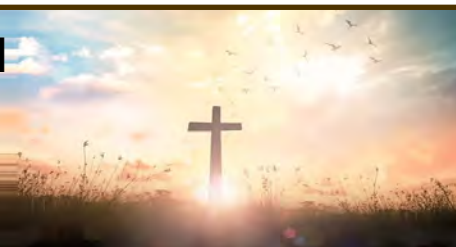
Homebound

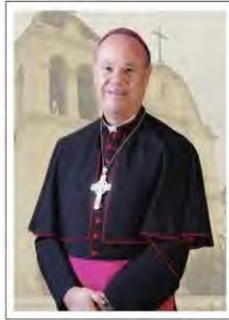

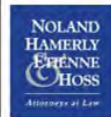

We are blessed to welcome Fr. David Allen to San Carlos Cathedral! Fr. David will serve as Parochial Vicar.

He grew up in San Luis Obispo and was homeschooled with his five sisters and brother. He attended Thomas Aquinas College in Santa Paula, CA and then entered St. Michael's Abbey of the Norbertine Fathers in Orange, CA. After a few years he left and studied theology at the International Theological Institute in Austria. At the re-emergence of his call, he entered our Diocese of Monterey, and has now been ordained five years.
