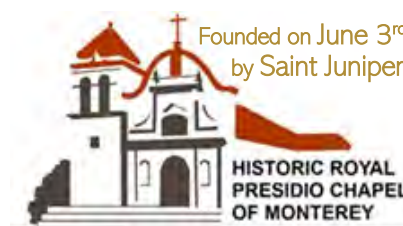

XV SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A focus on God's word and how people receive it. They remind us that God's message is meant to bring life, but it requires open hearts to grow.

- **Power of God's Word:** God's word is like rain that nourishes the earth. It always fulfills its purpose, just as the first reading says.
- **Fertile Hearts and Faith:** The parable of the sower shows that people respond to God in different ways. A heart that is open and willing to listen will grow in faith.
- **Challenges to Faith:** Some people struggle to hold on to God's message. Distractions, worries, and hardships can keep faith from growing.
- **Hope in Future Glory:** The second reading reminds us that present struggles are small compared to the joy that will come. This hope helps believers stay strong.
- **God's Generosity in Creation:** The psalm describes the beauty and richness of the earth. It reflects how God provides and blesses those who trust in Him.
- **Call to Listen and Understand:** Jesus explains that not everyone truly listens to God's word. Understanding takes effort and a desire to grow.

God's word is always working, but people must be ready to receive it. This Sunday calls us to trust, listen, and let faith take root.

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: FERTILE GROUND FOR GOD'S WORD

The Sundays in Ordinary Time continue to unfold, offering us the most significant sections from St. Matthew's Gospel until we arrive at the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time (also called the Feast of Christ the King) at the end of November. During this 15th week, the Church celebrates some important Feast days. Tuesday, July 14th, we celebrate St. Kateri Tekakwitha, a member of the Mohawk tribe from Québec, Canada, who died in 1680 after a life of great austerity and love. Wednesday, July 15th is the feast of the great Franciscan saint, St. Bonaventure, bishop and Doctor of the Church, who died in 1274. Thursday, July 16th is the Feast Day of our neighbors, the Carmelite Sisters in Carmel. We are grateful to God for the power of the witness of their cloistered religious life.

The Gospel Matthew 13:1 - 23

Parables feature prominently in the Gospel readings of the next several Sundays. These short, concrete stories use images from daily life to help explain the deeper realities of the Good News of Jesus Christ. This Sunday, Jesus compares God's Word to seeds – tiny things that grow into something greater. Under the right conditions, a small beginning yields a rich harvest. Yet so much depends upon the quality of the soil. The sower faithfully sows seeds in various soils, symbolizing the Word of God being sown in human hearts. Jesus' parable outlines common struggles that we face in receiving the Word and allowing it to take root and bear fruit in our lives. Sometimes hearts may be like shallow soil or perhaps too rocky to receive the seed of God's Word; sometimes hearts may be choked by the weeds of "worldly anxiety or the lure of riches." God's Word seeks the rich soil of the heart prepared to hear the Word and understand it. For those whose hearts are ready, the great harvest follows. Jesus, gentle gardener and sower of the seed of God's Word, prepare our hearts for this life-giving harvest of your love and life.

First Reading Isaiah 55:10 - 11

When the Israelites were exiled in Babylon, the assuring words that God had previously spoken to them now seemed empty. In today's passage, the Prophet Isaiah will use an image from nature to describe how God's Word always bear fruit and comes true, no matter how unlikely it may seem. God ensures that his Word will accomplish its purpose. His Word brings fertility, meaning, and significance to all of life. God assures us that when we attune ourselves to his Word, the Word will nourish and satisfy all our hungers.

Second Reading Romans 8:18 - 23

St. Paul address the suffering that we all experience in life, placing it within the context of future hope manifested in the Risen Jesus. Paul uses Genesis as a backdrop to explain that humans suffer as a result of their refusal to attune themselves to God. Because of this, humans not only made things more difficult for themselves, but they also brought all of creation down with them. Because of our human sin, creation cannot accomplish the purpose for which it was created: to be the means through which humans glorify and give praise to God. We, along with all of creation, groan as in labor pains for the fulfillment of God's saving action, already made real in the Risen Lord.

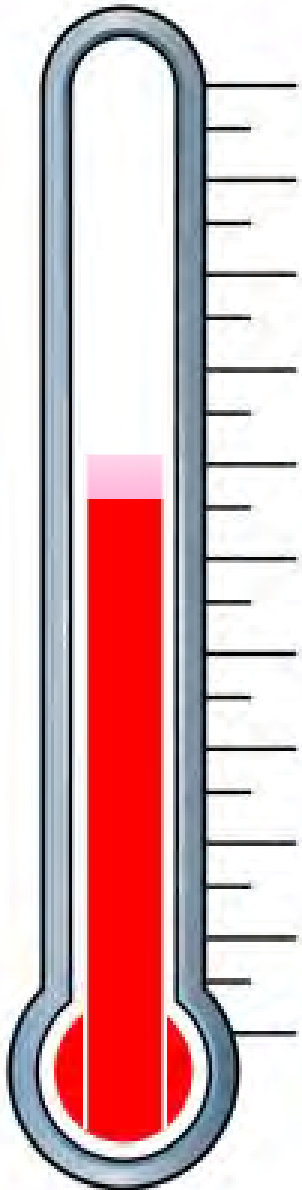

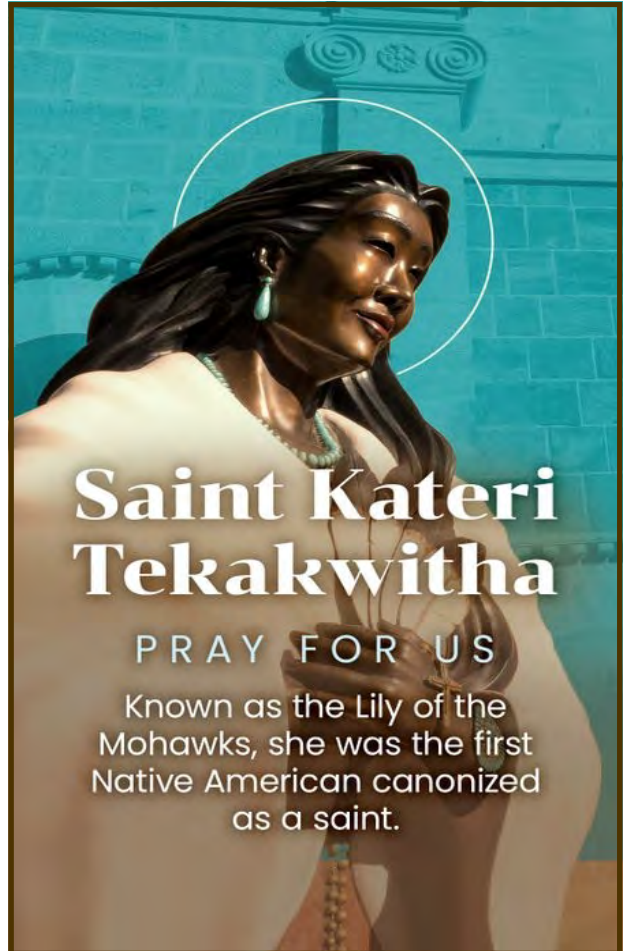

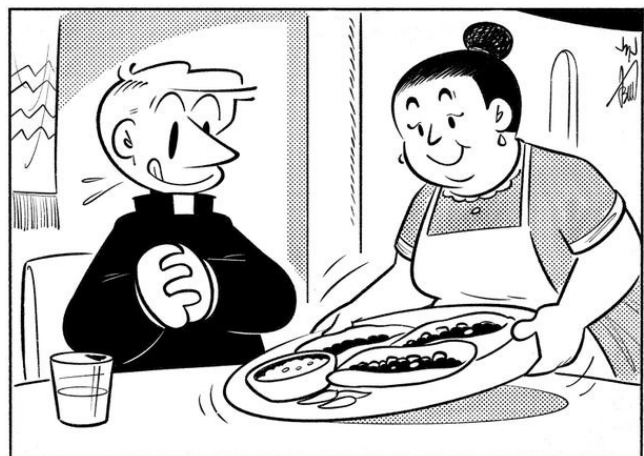

As you may know, August 1st will bring some changes to our parish staff! Last year when Fr. Ron Shirley retired and moved to Watsonville, Bishop Danny appointed Fr. Tim Nondorf to assist with Masses here at San Carlos.

Fr. Louie Bellen has served as both full time Vocations Director & Parochial Vicar here at the Cathedral since July of 2024, but effective August 1st, Bishop Ramón has appointed Fr. Louie as full time Vocations Director. Fr. Louie will remain in residence at the Cathedral.

We are blessed to welcome our new Parochial Vicar, Fr. David Allen, effective August 1st. Fr. David is currently Parochial Vicar at St. Patrick's Church in Watsonville. He grew up in San Luis Obispo and was homeschooled with his five sisters and brother. He attended Thomas Aquinas College in Santa Paula, CA and then entered St. Michael's Abbey of the Norbertine Fathers in Orange, CA. After a few years he left and studied theology at the International Theological Institute in Austria. At the re-emergence of his call, he entered our Diocese of Monterey, and has now been ordained five years. He loves the outdoors, travel/pilgrimage, books, and music, but most of all following Jesus as a priest. Fr. David also speaks Spanish. He is excited to be joining us!
