Luke 2:48-49
"And when they saw him, they were amazed: and his mother said unto him, Son, why have you thus dealt with us? behold, your father and I have sought you sorrowing." "And he said unto them, How is it that all of you sought me? know all of you not that I must be about my Father's business?"

At age twelve there are three things we see about Jesus here.
I) He knew the Heavenly Father
II) He knew the scriptures
III) He knew His purpose(the Father's business)

In the coming weeks we will be looking at these but today lets look at the relationship He had with the Father.

If you are reading this and you are past the age of twelve you are already too old. At the age of twelve Jesus had a relationship with the Father. Ask yourself. Do you have a relationship with God? You can decide to build a personal relationship with God. After the age of twelve you are fully responsible for your spiritual life. You can decide that you want to know God for yourself. That will be the most important decision you would make all the days of your life.
