
Student-host matching to begin Sunday, August 25th

About 1000 graduate and undergraduate international students arrive in August to begin their studies at UA. Not all will join IF, but we expect about 200 will seek a local resident as a friend and guide to living in Tucson.

In a change from previous years, matching of students to host families will begin on a specific date: Sunday, August 25. No matching requests will be accepted until that date. This change was made in response to some concerns that Welcome Dinner hosts often want to "friend" their student guests but find them already assigned. The IF Board hopes this change will allow all hosts a fair chance at selecting students.

And speaking of hosts, we need your help to recruit additional hosts for the 2013-2014 academic year. If you have not been a host recently, we invite you to sign up for a friend this fall. The IF online matching system is easy and enables hosts to review and select students of interest to them.

As you know, hosting is and expands your world! As a past or current host, you know your students in your lives and sharing acrivities with them. Tell your friends, neighbors and associates how these friendships and experiences have enriched your lives and encourage them to become a host to a new international student.



Go online to find your new I-Friends

International Friends has an online system for matching hosts with students. The system is user friendly and easily accessible: just follow a few simple steps. All you need is access to a computer with an internet connection.

STEP 1: CLICK THE LINK, USE YOUR PASSWORD

Click on http://ifriendstucson.org/login.html . It will take you to a login page.

Username: Enter your email address Password: Enter your password.

If you have forgotten your password, email Jim Moline at jim@ifriendstucson.org, using the email address with which you log into the I-Friends system. Jim will then email you with your password information.

STEP 2: EDIT PROFILE

Once you have entered your password, it will take you to your profile page. Please edit or update any information about your profile.

STEP 3: SELECT A STUDENT

Search through the students who are seeking a host to find student(s) that look like a good match. Select the students.

STEP 4: MEET YOUR STUDENT

Once you have selected a student, our Assignments Coordinator will confirm the match and send you and your student an email with the other's contact information. You can then contact your student to arrange your first get-together.

Matching process **FAQs**

Q. What if my student doesn't respond?

A. Sometimes your selected student may not reply to your initial phone call or email. This can simply mean that the student is adjusting to a demanding academic schedule or life in a new country. Try contacting the student again after a week or two. Schedule a get-acquainted meeting once the student has acclimated to life in the US. If after several tries there is no student response to you, advise jim@ifriendstucson.org and then select another student.

Q. My student's email came back. Now what?

A. International students often change their email address once enrolled at UA. Students' current email addresses are located in the UA online student directory. To locate a student's e-mail or phone number go to www.arizona.edu/phonebook. Type in the student's name at the phonebook prompt. The student's current information will appear.

Q. I want a student from Germany, but I can't find one.

A. Enrollment patterns determine the numbers and represented countries of international students at the University of Arizona. Typically, International Friends has students from many countries around the globe with the highest number from China and India. It is not always possible to find students from a specific country, so remain flexible in your student choices. It can be a rewarding and satisfying experience.
