# LANGUAGE B: FRENCH , HINDI

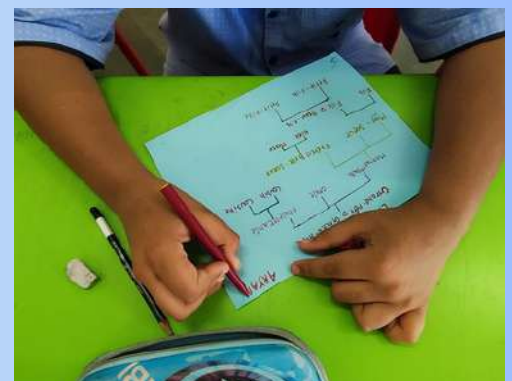
## Craft Your Perfect Week:

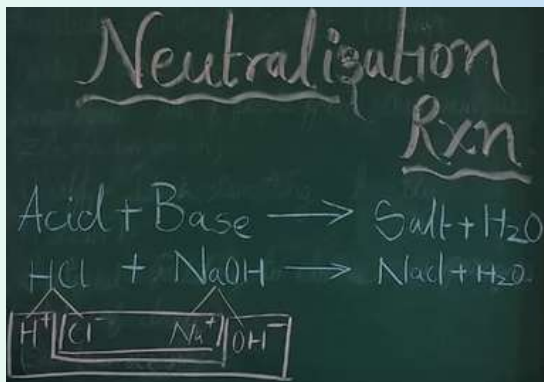

# SCIENCES- EXPERIMENTAL LEARNING

**Neutralization Reaction:** In this activity, MYP 5 students explored neutralization reactions, where an acid and a base react to form water and a salt. They learned that this reaction involves the combination of  $H^+$  ions and  $OH^-$  ions, resulting in a solution with a pH of 7 when a strong acid reacts with a strong base. This exercise provided valuable insights into acid-base chemistry and the concept of neutral solutions.



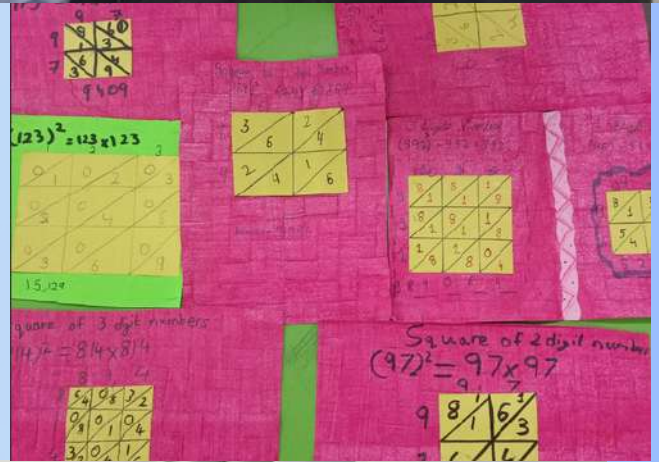

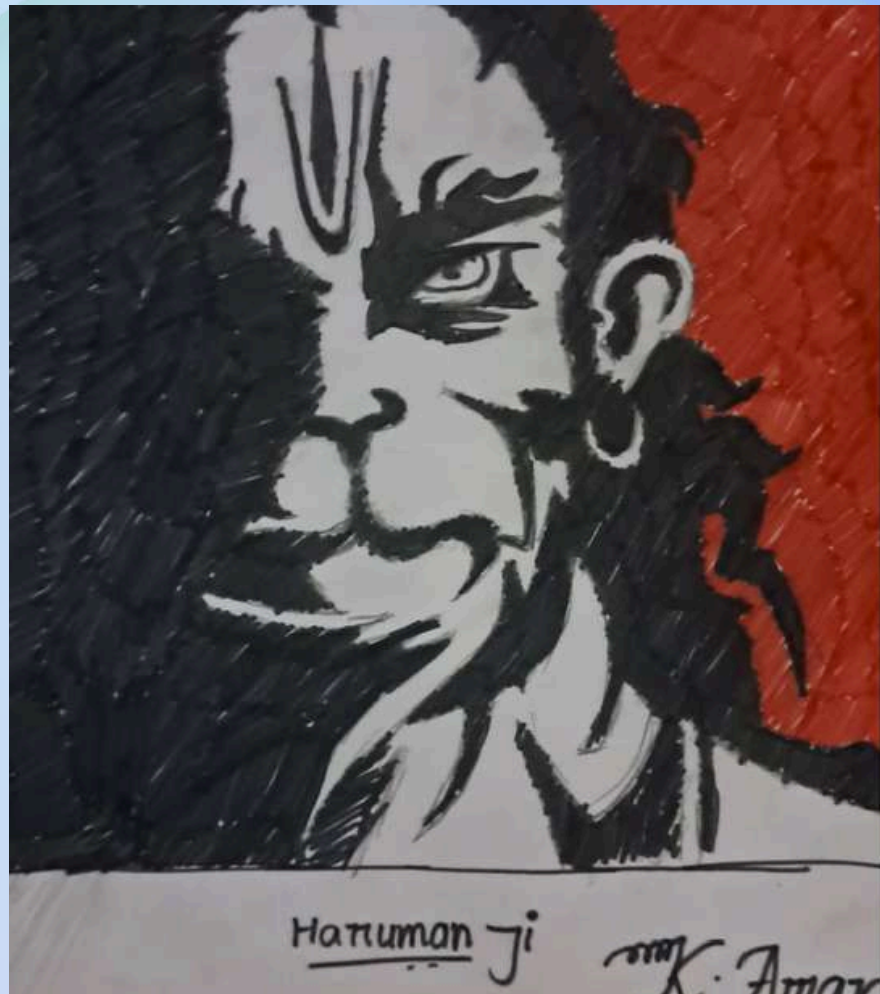

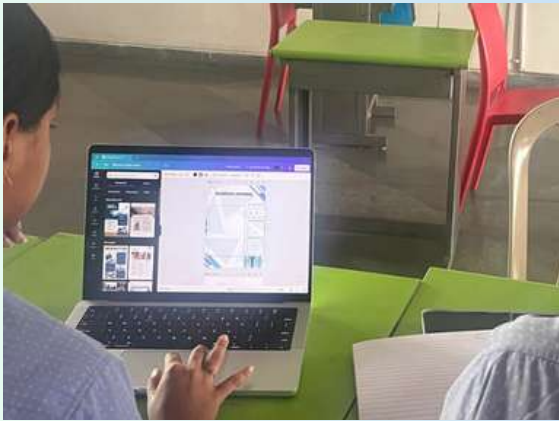
