

NHRC funded Major Research Project on Working of Ashram Schools in Central India is Approved







The final report of the NHRC-sponsored research project titled "An empirical study on working of Ashram Schools (boys and girls residential) with special reference to tribal areas located on Inter-state border areas of Central India (Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh)" was successfully submitted to the National Human Rights Commission and it was approved by the NHRC. The study was conducted by Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies -TC Prof. (Dr.) Rashmi Salpekar, Principal Investigator & Dr. Navjeet Sidhu Kundal, Co-investigator. Thinking Box

10 JULY: GLOBAL ENERGY INDEPENDENCE DAY

Global Energy Independence Day is celebrated annually on July 10 worldwide to highlight the urgent need to reduce reliance on non-renewable energy sources. This observance stresses the importance of transitioning to cleaner, more sustainable energy systems, encouraging investment in renewable technologies, improving energy efficiency, and promoting sustainable practices for a healthier planet.

In alignment with these goals, the Government of India and the World Bank have signed a \$500 million agreement to develop the Green National Highway Corridors Project (GNHCP). Spanning 781 kilometers across Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and Andhra Pradesh, the project has a total cost of \$1.29 billion and is set for completion by May 2026. It will use innovative approaches such as recycled materials and bio-



engineering techniques to reduce carbon emissions and conserve resources while enhancing connectivity, boosting trade, creating jobs, and fostering inclusive growth.

ARTICLES OF THE CONSTIUTION	DESCRIPTION
1. Article 48A	a. This article empowers Panchayat to prepare plans for economic development and social justice, including matters related to efficient use of energy and its conservation.
2. Article 39(b)	b. This article grants Parliament, the power to make laws for implementing international treaties, agreements and conventions. India is a signatory to various international agreements like Paris agreement, which emphasis energy conservation as a means to reduce carbon emissions.

4. Article 47	d. The state shall endeavour to protect and improve the environment and to safeguard the forest and wildlife of the country.
5. Article 243g	e. It is the fundamental duty of every citizen to protect and improve the natural environment, including forests, lakes, rivers, and wildlife to have compassion for living creatures.
6. Article 253	f. The ownership and control of the material resources of the community are so distributed as best to subserve the common good

Domestic Legal News

Supreme Court held Muslim women's right to seek maintenance under Section 125 of CrPC, 1973 as well as the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Divorce) Act, 1986

10 July 2024: The Supreme Court declared that a Muslim woman had the right to seek maintenance under Section 125 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 as well as under the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Divorce) Act of 1986. The court concluded that Section 125 covers all married women, including Muslim married women and non-Muslim divorced women.

Supreme Court held the right to life and personal liberty enshrined under Article 21 of the Constitution of India is overarching and sacrosanct

18 July 2024: The Supreme Court of India has declared that a court cannot be prevented from providing bail to an accused because of restrictive statutory provisions in a criminal code if the accused's right under Article 21 of the Constitution is violated. The court further stated that while interpreting a criminal code, a constitutional court must favour constitutionalism and the rule of law, both of which include liberty.

Supreme Court Denies to Cancel NEET UG 2024

23 July 2024: The Supreme Court has rejected a plea to cancel the National Entrance-cum-Eligibility Test-Undergraduate Exam, 2024 (NEET-UG, 2024), stating it would be unjustified. The court directed IIT, Delhi to create an expert committee to determine the correct answer to a question modified by the National Testing Agency based on obsolete NCERT books. The court also accepted IIT Delhi's submission on a physics question modified by the NTA. The court allowed students with unresolved difficulties to seek legal rights and remedies. The court also examined the reasons behind students' movement to three centres, such as coaching, parent transfers, and government personnel.

Supreme Court held the judgement by the court is a part of public record and does not fall in the ambit of the 'Right to be Forgotten'

24 July 2024: In a Special Leave Petition (SLP) brought by Ikanoon Software Development Pvt. Ltd. (Indian Kanoon) challenging the Madras High Court's decision to erase a judgement off its website based on the right to be forgotten, the Bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala, and Justice Manoj Misra stayed the challenged Judgment's instructions to delete a judgement in which the petitioner before the High Court was acquitted in a rape case.

Supreme Court held States power to levy tax on mineral rights, as per the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act 1957

25 July 2024: The Supreme Court decided that states have the authority to charge taxes on mineral rights and that the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act 1957 does not limit this authority. The majority judgment was delivered by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud with the single dissent of Justice B.V. Nagarathna. The court also rejected the judgments in India Cement Ltd ν . State of Tamil Nadu AIR 1990 SC 85, ruling that the Parliament lacks the authority to tax mineral rights under Entry 50 List I.

Supreme Court: Excessive enrolment fees charged by SBCs violate Section 24(1)(f) of the Advocates Act, creating barriers for economically weaker sections

30 July 2024: The Supreme Court decided that disproportionate enrolling fees paid by State Bar Councils (SBCs) in India violate Section 24(1)(f) of the Advocates Act, 1961 creating impediments for economically disadvantaged groups and denying substantive equality. The court argued that the existing enrolling fee system is arbitrary and undermines substantive equality, particularly to marginalised and economically disadvantaged groups. The court further stated that the Advocates Act, 1961 grants every advocate the right to practise in all courts across India and that the right to practise law is a basic right guaranteed by Article 19(1)(g) of the Constitution.

International Legal News

ICC holds Al Hassan guilty of Crimes Against Humanity and War Crimes

26 June 2024: On June 26, the International Criminal Court (ICC) convicted Al Hassan Ag Abdoul Aziz Ag Mohamed Ag Mahmoud on several counts of crimes against humanity and war crimes, including for contributing to the crime against humanity of persecution on grounds of religion perpetrated by members of the armed groups.

European Court of Human Rights Finds Russia Guilty of Systematic Human Rights Violations in Crimea

27 June 2024: The European Court of Human Rights (ECHR) has unanimously ruled against Russia, finding systematic human rights violations in Crimea since its occupation in 2014. The court noted widespread reports of intimidation, harassment, and physical violence targeting individuals who opposed Russia's presence in Crimea or identified as ethnic Ukrainians or Crimean Tatars.

ICJ Allows Seven Nations to Intervene in Rohingya Genocide Case

10 July 2024: The ICJ has allowed seven countries (Maldives, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, the Netherlands, and the UK) to intervene in the ongoing genocide case against Myanmar brought by the Gambia under Article 63 of the ICJ Statute.

UNGA Adopts Draft Resolution to Bridge Global AI Gaps

11 July 2024: The 78th Session of the UN General Assembly has adopted a draft resolution introduced by China to enhance international cooperation on building AI capacity, particularly in developing countries. The resolution aims to bridge the "AI divide" by promoting knowledge sharing, funding, and capacity-building assistance.

ICJ gives Advisory Opinion in the Occupied Palestinian Territory Case

19 July 2024: The International Court of Justice has given its Advisory Opinion in respect of the *Legal Consequences arising from the Policies and Practices of Israel in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem*. It concluded that Israel's continued presence in Palestine is unlawful, and the former is obligated to end its occupation as rapidly as possible. Israel also has the obligation to make reparations for the damage caused as a result of its unlawful presence. The UNGA and UNSC were recommended to formulate precise modalities to bring a rapid end to the atrocities in Palestine.
